### **CONVENING OF THE QUEZON CITY CBMS COORDINATING BOARD FOR THE FIRST ROLLOUT OF THE COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING SYSTEM**

QUEZON CITY, PHILIPPINES- The Quezon City CBMS Coordinating Board (QCCCB) held a meeting last 17 March 2023 as the 2023 Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) initial rollout draws closer.
