POPULATION OF BARANGAY TEACHERS VILLAGE EAST, QUEZON CITY

(Results based from 2015 Census of Population)

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The Census of Population, which is a complete enumeration of households in the country, is designed primarily to take an inventory of the population of all barangays in the Philippines as mandated by RA No. 10625 and Executive Order No. 352. It also collects information about some characteristics of the population such as age, sex, marital status, and highest grade completed.

This special release presents data on the population of Barangay Teachers Village East, Quezon City. Figures are based from the tabulated data of the 2015 Census of Population.

Total Population of Barangay Teachers Village East Reaches 3,401

The total population of Barangay Teachers Village East, Quezon City reached 3,401 as of August 1, 2015. East, Quezon City: 2015 This accounts for 0.1 percent of the city's total population. The household population of Barangay Teachers Village East was equal to its total

population since there were no institutional population or those residing in institutional


living quarters such as hotels, hospitals, orphanages, homes for the aged, jails, and military camps.

Of the household population, 1,150 or 45.6 percent were male while 1,851 or 54.4 percent were female. These figures resulted to a sex ratio of 84 males per 100 females.

Persons Aged 20 to 24 Years Comprise the Largest Age Group

The age-sex distribution of the population showed that persons aged 20 to 24 years comprised the largest age group, making up 12.1 percent of the household population. This was followed by those in the age groups 25 to 29 years (11.2 percent) then 15 to 19 years and 30 to 34 years (both at 10.7 percent).

Females outnumbered males in the age groups 0 to 54 years and in the older age groups, 55 years old and over. Refer to Table 2 for details.

Median Age is 29 Years

In 2015, the median age of the household population of Barangay Teachers Village East was 29. This means that half of the household population was younger than 29 years. This was higher than the median age of Quezon City which was 26 years.

Four in Five of the Household Population are of Voting Age


A total of 2,599 or 76.4 percent of the barangay's household populace belonged to the voting population or those aged 18 years and over. There were more female voters (1,460 or 56.2 percent) than male voters (1,139 or 43.8 percent). *Refer to Table 3 for details.*

Senior Citizens Constitute 9.1 Percent of the Household Population

People who were regarded as senior citizens were those aged 60 years and over. In 2015, senior citizens made up 9.1 percent of the barangay's household population. Among the senior citizens, females (61.2 percent) outnumbered males (38.8 percent). Refer to Table 2 for details.

Overall Dependency Ratio Totals 33 Dependents

The overall dependency ratio of Barangay Teachers Village East was 33, which indicates that for every 100 working-age population, there were about 33 dependents (24 young dependents and 9 old dependents). This was lower than the overall dependency ratio of Quezon City which was 44 dependents. *Refer to Table 4 for details.*





One Elderly for Every Two Children Below 15 Years

The ageing index or the proportion of persons aged 60 years and over per 100 persons under the age of 15 years in Barangay Teachers Village East registered 50.9 percent. This translates to one person aged 60 years and over for every two children under 15 years old.

Never Been Married Persons Tally 59.7 Percent

Of the total household population 10 years old and over, 59.7 percent has never been married while 29.8 percent was married. The rest of the population was categorized as follows: common-law/live-in (3.5 percent), widowed (3.2 percent), divorced/separated (1.9 percent) and unknown (2.0 percent). Among those that has never been married, a higher proportion in females (53.7 percent) than in males (46.3 percent) was recorded. Likewise, the proportion of females was higher than males among those who were widowed (84.2 percent), divorced/separated (77.2 percent), married (53.0 percent), common-law/live-in (52.9 percent) and unknown (57.6 percent). *Refer to Table 5 for details*.

Females Outnumber Males Among Baccalaureate Degree Holders

Of the total household population 5 years old and over, 40.6 percent were baccalaureate degree holders, 21.6 percent had attended or completed high school education, 15.6 percent were college undergraduates and 10.7 percent had attended or completed elementary school education. Among those baccalaureate degree holders, there were more females (56.3 percent) than males (43.7 percent). *Refer to Table 6 for details*.

Simple Literacy Rate is Recorded at 99.1 Percent

Barangay Teachers Village East recorded a literacy rate of 99.1 percent which was higher than the total literacy rate of Quezon City that was at 98.3 percent. Literacy rate was the same among females and males (both at 99.1 percent). *Refer to Table 7 for details*.

Two in Every Three Persons are Engaged in a Gainful Activity

Approximately two in every three persons (66.0 percent) were engaged in a gainful activity during the 12 months preceding the census. Among the major occupation groups, professionals comprised the largest group (21.9 percent). Clerical support workers came next (19.7 percent), followed by workers engaged in elementary occupations (14.9 percent). *Refer to Table 8 for details*.

TECHNICAL NOTES

The 2015 Census of Population (POPCEN 2015) was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) in August 2015 as mandated by Republic Act No. 10625, otherwise known as the Philippine Statistics Act of 2013. It was the 14th census of population that was undertaken since the first census in 1903. POPCEN 2015 was designed to take an inventory of the total population all over the Philippines and collect information about their characteristics. Census day for the POPCEN 2015 was August 1, 2015 (12:01 a.m.). POPCEN 2015 made use of the de jure concept of enumeration wherein households and persons are enumerated in the area where they usually reside as of the census reference date. Enumeration lasted for about 25 days, from 10 August to 6 September 2015. Enumeration was extended until 15 September 2015 for large provinces and some highly urbanized cities.
