

Data on size, distribution and demographic characteristics of the population are vital in planning and decision making process of the government and private businesses alike. The data can be of assistance in determining what, where, when and how public services and facilities should be put in place. The impact of services, programs and projects implemented are measured from the effect on the socioeconomic well-being of the populace as the fundamental beneficiaries of governance and development. Entrepreneurs, corporate executives and managers in the private sectors use the data in making decisions on how the resources will be distributed for their investment.

This chapter presents data series pertaining to the region and city/municipality, where available series include the population count taken during the 2007, 2010 and 2015 censuses conducted nationwide.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Annual growth rate of the NCR in terms of population is continuously decelerating from 1995 to 2015.
- By marital status between sexes, there are more single male than female but more married female than male in 2015.
- The most language generally spoken at home is Tagalog with 95 percent of the number of households in NCR followed by Bisaya and Bikol respectively in 2010.
- In 2015, City of Navotas and City of Valenzuela are the only cities in NCR that has dominant number of male than female.

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





Chapter 2 Income and Prices

 \mathcal{D} ata on the levels and patterns of family income and expenditure, poverty incidence and threshold and price indices are vital indicators of the socioeconomic status of the people. Specifically, these data provide a picture of the standard of living, the varying degrees of inequality, the purchasing capacity, and the demand for the goods and services of families. The data are essential in the conceptualization and assessment of poverty alleviation programs of government, private and non-government organizations. The trends, patterns and signals shown by the data have been giving wide and serious attention due to the farreaching ramifications on policies and programs aimed at people empowerment. The usage of the data has accordingly permeated all echelons of the government bureaucracy, private businesses and even ordinary citizens themselves. With the support provided by the data, interventions can be implemented to help the citizenry respond to situations brought about by the increased prices and incidence of poverty and low-income capacity, among others.

his chapter presents data for the region and by city/municipality pertaining to family income, expenditures and consumer price indices. Several indicators derived from these basic data such as poverty incidence and threshold, inflation rate and purchasing power of peso are presented in this chapter. The income, expenditures, price data and poverty statistics are generated from the results of the Family Income and Expenditures Survey (FIES) and price surveys of the Philippine Statistics Authority.

HIGHLIGHTS

 The average annual family income in NCR increased by 19.4 percent, from Php 356,000 in 2012 to Php 425,000 in 2015. Likewise, the average family expenditure in the region went up by 12.9 percent, from Php 309, 000 in 2012 to Php 349,000 in 2015.

- The annual per capita poverty threshold of a family in NCR was estimated at Php 25,007 in 2015. With this threshold, a family needed at least P 2,083.92 per month to meet the basic food and non-food requirements.
- In 2015, 3.9 percent of the population was poor in NCR.



Chapter 3 Economic Accounts

The economic accounts of the region, which is presented in terms of the Gross Regional Domestic Product (GRDP), provide a comprehensive quantitative description of the regional economy. Specifically, the GRDP illustrates the level and growth of the region's economic output for a given period. Moreover, it shows the structure of the regional economy whether it is predominantly agricultural or industrial. It also highlights the sectors that contributed to and are of great potential to the region's growth. Lastly, the GRDP, as a macroeconomic indicator of economic performance, is not only essential in charting the socio-economic growth path of the region, but also essential in planning, policy formulation and analytical exercises.

This chapter presents the GRDP on an annual basis in terms of levels, growth rates, and indices at constant and current prices. The National Statistical Coordination Board generates the series from primary and secondary data gathered from various sources in the country.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Service industry has the highest share in Gross Regional Domestic Product of the National Capital Region garnering 83.0 percent at constant 2000 prices in the year 2016.
- Since 2012, the highest report of growth rate in GRDP of NCR was in 2013 with 12.3 percent compared to 9.5 percent of 2016.
- NCR has the highest per capita among regions in the Philippines in year 2016.

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



Chapter 4 Environment and Natural Resources

The region's natural resources need to be protected and preserved and so there is a need for sound and effective policies for the proper management of these precious natural assets. Therefore, data regarding the environmental situation in the region is essential as a basis for proper formulation and design of conservation efforts to protect and conserve biodiversity. All these concerns give emphasis to the need for more reliable, timely and comprehensive data. The data are critical not only to the government and private sector but as well as the international community in their formulation of measures to safeguard the environment and natural resources and to remedy destruction and degradation to these areas.

his chapter presents data on existing/available land, watershed, and protected areas of the region and its cities and municipality. The data were generated from the National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (NAMRIA), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), specifically the Forest Management Bureau (FMB) and the Mines and Geo-Sciences Bureau (MGB).

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2006, 95.9 percent of the forestland in NCR is still unclassified in terms of its land classification.
- Quezon City has the highest area planted under the national greening program of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources from 2011 to 2016.
- In 2016, 483,389 seedlings were planted under the National Greening Program by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources across NCR.





 \mathcal{O} ata on agriculture and agrarian reform are vital in the formulation of programs and policies geared towards the development of the agriculture and fishery sectors. In fact, improving the condition of the agriculture sector is a priority thrust of the government today. This is anchored on the situation where its part in providing food for the survival of the population. This also means focusing on the agrarian reform program in order to promote social justice, sound rural development and industrialization. Hence, these data become the bases for the redirection of the focus of our legislators to the advancement of the agriculture and fisheries sectors. The data also provide indicators of the successes and impacts of strategies and programs in the lives of farmers and fisher folks in the countryside.

his chapter presents data on fishery production, the number of slaughtered animals as well as the number of registered cooperatives in the region. These statistics are from the Philippine Statistics Authority. Data on cooperatives were taken from the Cooperative Development Authority.

HIGHLIGHTS

- From 2003 to 2012, the number of fishes produced decreased to 75,946 MT.
- The total number of registered cooperatives from 2011 to 2016 reached to 936. Furthermore, within this period, the number of dissolved, liquidated, canceled and delisted cooperatives was 709.
- Credit cooperatives have the most number of registrations during 2016, which comprised 32 percent of the total number of registered cooperatives. This was followed by housing and consumers cooperatives with 28 and 20 percent, respectively.





Chapter 6 Establishment Characteristic: Industrial Sector

 \mathcal{D} ata on the industries obtaining in the region and investments serve as gauge of the extent of the area's attractiveness and capability to absorb entrepreneurial ventures. An analysis of the data on the size and growth of industries and the stock and flow of investments shows the enabling factors that provide or enhance the comparative advantages enjoyed by industries and investors in the area. On the other hand, the data can give indications of the limiting factors that hinder the entry, growth, and movement of industries and investments. With the data providing signals, the concerned governmental instrumentalities can formulate policies, enforce regulations and undertake infrastructure programs and other forms of assistance to business and prospective investors. Armed with the data, key decision makers in the government and the private sectors can also forge alliances to improve the business climate and environment. Ultimately, the policies and measures implemented as well as the alliances can serve as instruments for achieving growth and providing employment opportunities, among others, to the region's labor force.

his chapter presents regional and city/municipal data were available, on the number of establishments by sector, distribution of manufacturing establishments, the number, floor area and value of private building construction and the value of investments and exports in the region. The data sources are the Philippine Statistics Authority for the exports, establishments and building construction data and the Department of Trade and Industry-Board of Investments for the investments and employment generated.

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2014, Wholesale and Retail Trade; Repair of Motor Vehicles and Motorcycles has the most number of establishments by industry sector with total employment of 20 and over in NCR, with 3,687. On the other hand, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing has the least number with only 17 number of establishments.
- The total number of approved building permits in NCR increased by 42.8 percent from 8,626 in 2015 to 12,318 in 2016.
- City of Mandaluyong has the highest number of employment generated in 2015.







Chapter 7 **Trade**

2 ata on trade reflect the extent of the inward and outward flow of commodities in an area. The data likewise indicate the commodities that go into the export and import markets or are used for domestic or foreign consumption. Proprietors and the managers and executives of private businesses can use the data in identifying markets with high potentials and in making decisions on which commodities to produce and what markets to penetrate. Leaders and implementers in the government, on the other hand, can conceptualize and initiate programs, projects, services and facilities designed to further stimulate trading activities in high yielding areas and/or in those sectors where a demand and supply gap exists. The data are also useful in identifying areas and products that can be improved/promoted for global competitiveness.

his chapter presents data on the volume and value of commodities that enters ports located in the region either for exports or imports and the value of commodity flow by mode of transport. The Philippine Statistics Authority is the source of the data, which are processed from administrative reporting forms by agencies in government involved in the collection of customs and tariff charges, or administration of ports.

HIGHLIGHTS

- From 2011 to 2016, the trend of domestic outflow of NCR was fluctuating. Trade transactions are always higher during first and second quarters and lower during third and fourth quarters.
- The most used mode of transporting commodities towards outside NCR is through water; followed by air. From 2007 onwards, there were no recorded rail transactions in the region.
- In terms of the balance of domestic trade, the region suffered a deficit in the third quarter of 2015 and first quarter of 2016.
- In 2013, the total commodity flow of the region was 230 billion.







 \mathcal{D} ata on tourism provide a panorama of the region as a tourist destination. The significance of the picture presented by the data manifests the importance accorded to the tourism industry by both national and local leaders. Specifically, tourism has become a twin source of foreign exchange receipts and livelihood and employment opportunities for communities. Data on the industry are therefore essential in providing vital links in the development and orchestration of campaigns aimed at promoting the potentials of the region as a tourist hideaway. Local leaders can put up infrastructure programs and institute policies and regulations that will boost the inflow of visitors. Investors, on the other hand, can take the signals by developing tourist and recreational sites and putting up establishments and amenities. In concrete terms, the data likewise provide a quantitative measure of the result of programs that promote the area as a traveler's destination and the industry's contributions to the economic performance of the area.

This chapter presents regional and/or city/municipal data on the visitor arrivals and their countries of residence/origin and the number of hotel and hotel rooms and other accommodation establishments. The data source is the Department of Tourism.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The total number of accommodation establishments in the region as of 2015 was 472, a 16.5 percent increase from 2014 figure of 405.
- Average occupancy rate of accommodation facilities in the region slightly decrease from 67.21 percent in 2014 to 67.0 percent in 2015.
- City of Manila has the highest number of tourist attractions in NCR as of 2015 with 22, which is 22.7 percent of the total tourist attractions of the region.







 \mathcal{D} ata on vital events, health and nutrition are key inputs to programs aimed at providing the basic minimum services to the citizenry. The data provide a profile of the health status and the level, causes and patterns of mortality and morbidity of the population. The health and nutrition status of the people are an utmost concern of local governance. The focus of current development efforts is towards extending better services and expanding the delivery system. This is anchored on the concept that no individual should be deprived of the right to health care. Furthermore, the strength and wellbeing of the people influence their capabilities to engage in various economic endeavors. The health and nutrition status of the population should therefore be a priority in public service and resolved immediately so as to truly empower the people, an objective of growth and development. These concerns and objectives necessitate the provision of the data as bases in the delivery of services catering to the health and nutritional requirements of individuals.

This chapter presents statistics for the region and its cities/municipalities on the registration of vital events occurring in the areas. The data include the number of births and deaths including infant, fetal and maternal deaths, and leading causes of mortality. This chapter likewise contains data on health facilities, bed to population ratio of hospitals and health workers. Meanwhile, the data on health and nutrition presented include the nutritional status of children and leading causes of morbidity. The data are sourced from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Department of Health (DOH) and National Nutrition Council (NNC).

HIGHLIGHTS

- Heart disease was the leading cause of morbidity in NCR in 2015 with 9,744 number of cases. This translates 75 deaths per 1,000 population. On the other hand, Pneumonia/Bronchopneumonia was the number one leading cause of deaths among infants with 796 cases or three deaths per 100,000 livebirths.
- The total number of barangay health stations in 2016 was 478 reflecting a ratio of 27,134 persons per health station.



Chapter 10 Education

Data on the country's educational system are essential in the planning, implementation and supervision of programs in this field. The primary goal of these programs is to develop a meaningful and efficient educational system in the country in order to update the quality of our educational system at all levels. Education is crucial in bringing the desired behavioral and attitudinal changes in the population to effect socio-economic development. Literacy calls for serious efforts to continuously improve and promote the accessibility of our educational system to changes in the socio-economic pretense a challenge to our decision makers and educators. To address these challenges in the most efficient and effective way, an adequate and timely supply of data focusing on the levels and state of resources of our educational system is in fact vital.

This chapter presents data on important aspects of the educational system at the regional down to the provincial and city levels. The statistics presented include enrolment and number of school and graduate in government and private. The chapter contains several desired indicators, such as student-teacher/pupil ratio and performance indicators, literacy rates and highest grade completed to mention some. The basic sources of data are the Department of Education (DepEd), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).

HIGHLIGHTS

- Quezon City has the highest number of elementary government schools in NCR in SY 2016-17, with a total of 96, which is 18.6 percent of the total number of elementary government schools of the region.
- Business and Management education recorded 35,341 graduates in SY 2015-2016 which is 36.52 percent of the total higher education graduates of the region.

• Elementary completion rate in the region decreased from 82.44 percent in SY 2013-14 to 72.41 percent in SY 2014-15.

Zata on labor and employment are critical inputs in the formulation of policies aimed at providing adequate employment opportunities and productive activities to the country's labor force. The labor force is the backbone of the economy. This single factor alone speaks of a vital sector that plays a crucial role in the development of the nation and the upliftment of the economic well-being of the people. Data on the situation obtaining in the workplace are also necessary in enhancing policies and programs of government towards promoting harmonious labor relations and productivity. The generation of adequate, timely and reliable data is an imperative need of the formulators and implementers of our laws, policies and decisions.

his chapter presents data on the number and employment status of the labor force at the Regional level. The data presented include labor statistics by sex, class of worker, major industry group, type of industry, major occupation group, and number of hours worked. Data on labor relations and workers' welfare, which include the number of workers terminated due to closures/retrenchments are also presented. The basic sources of data are the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE). The PSA generates data on the labor force and its employment status using the results of its quarterly Labor Force Surveys.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Labor Force Participation Rate (LFPR) was recorded at 63.1 percent in 2016, higher by 0.2 percentage points from 62.9 percent LFPR in 2015.
- Employment rate in the region rose to 93.4 percent in 2016 from 91.5 percent in 2015. In effect, the unemployment rate decreased by 6.6 percent in 2016 from 8.5 percent in 2015.

• CALABARZON contributed 17.9 percent Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) in 2015 from the 2.4 million OFWs in the Philippines. It is the largest contribution among the regions.







Chapter 12 Social Services

 \mathcal{D} ata on social welfare serve as indicators of the results and impacts of goals, policies and programs on human development. This universal concern emphasizes people's empowerment and the care, protection and rehabilitation of the disadvantaged and special sectors of society. These sectors are the primary target clienteles of our social welfare policies and programs. The objective is to place the disadvantaged sectors of society in the mainstream of productive and economic processes. Specifically, this entails converting the disadvantaged groups into active agents and partners in development. In this manner, the fruits of growth and progress will pervade all sectors of society and the disadvantaged sectors will become beneficiaries of development. The government's Social Reform Agenda (SRA) redirects the thrusts and focus and widens the target beneficiaries of the package of programs and other interventions implemented by government, private and nongovernmental institutions. In contributing to the goals of social welfare and development, the generation of data and relevant indicators is therefore of utmost necessity. The SRA, for one, underscores the need to strengthen and improve existing systems for generating data.

his chapter presents data at the regional and provincial levels on the number of clients served by the various outreach and service programs of the Department of Social Welfare and Development. The department, which is the source of data, compiles the information based on its administrative reporting systems. This chapter also contains data on the number of disabled persons by type of disability. The Philippine Statistics Authority processed the data based on the results of the 2000 and 2010 Census of Population and Housing.

HIGHLIGHTS

 Number of women in especially difficult circumstances (WEDC) served by DSWD is 630 in 2016, higher by 1.8 percent from the year 2015 of 619. The type of violence with the most number of cases is victims of illegal prostitution. • Number of Children In Need of Special Protection (CNSP) served by DSWD declined by 5.6 percent, from 744 in 2015 to 702 in 2016.



Chapter 13 Transportation and Communication

 $\mathcal D$ ata on the extent and coverage of the transportation and communication networks of an area are essential. The data provide the planners and decision makers in the government and in entrepreneurial ventures with a sound basis to improve the state of their infrastructures. Specifically, planners use the data in the formulation of strategies that will link the locality with its neighbors within and outside the country. The different mode of transportation and channels and media for communication are vital in the economic, social and cultural lives of peoples and institutions in the community. A well-developed transportation system ensures fast and efficient transfer of goods and services between traders, households and other institutions within and outside the geographical limits of the community. Similarly, breakthrough in the communication system accelerates the flow of information. This era of information technology enables a faster access to and dissemination of news, events and developments in the domestic and international scene. The business community receives vital information that can expand the market for their products and services. The continuous provision of data on the transportation and communication systems of an area therefore becomes indispensable in charting the course towards socioeconomic development and cultural uplift of the area.

This chapter presents data on modes of transportation at the regional and city levels. On the land transport, the data presented include the registration of motor vehicles and permits/licenses issued by the Land Transportation Office (LTO). The data presented also include the road length and the number and length of bridges; the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) is the source of data. For the communication sector, the chapter provides data on the number of telecommunication facilities, licensed radio stations, telephone distribution, post offices and volume of mail handled. The sources of data is the National Telecommunication Commission (NTC).

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2016, the total number of registered vehicles in NCR was 2,403,803. Motorcycles/tricycles recorded the highest number followed by utility vehicles comprising 39.6 percent and 25.5 percent respectively of the total. Buses has the least number contributing only 0.6 percent of the total number of registered vehicles.
- Most of the vehicles registered in the LTO were for private use. It comprised 91.7 percent of the total number of registered vehicles. On the other hand, 7.4 percent were used for hire while only 0.8 and 0.1 percent for government and diplomats, respectively.
- In LRT Line 1, EDSA Station recorded the highest number of passenger traffic entries and exits while Recto Station for LRT Line 2 during 2014.
- The most common mode of transportation in terms of railways, are MRT and LRT Line 1.
- The number of passengers in railways dropped in April. This is the season when most of the classes ends.







Chapter 14 Energy and Water

Data on energy and water resources are vital inputs to national and local programs of government. The business/industry sector also uses the data in the preparation of feasibility studies and in investment planning. The importance of these resources in countryside development is recognized in many ways. Energy and water are essential resources in countryside development are recognized in many institutions operating locality. his chapter presents regional data on power and water. Data on power includes electric generation by plant type. The data of water contains sales of water. The sources of this chapter are the Department of Energy, Manila Electric Company and Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The volume of water consumed by Metro Manila reduced by 21.2 percent, from 461,350,333 cu.m. in 2015 to 363,488,395 cu.m. in 2016.
- Domestic or residential consumers used up to 589,577,662 cu. m. or 68.4 percent of the total water consumed in 2016.
- Likewise, the electricity consumption of NCR increased by 7.98 percent from 23,967,048 Mwh in 2015 to 25,878,439 Mwh in 2016.

Chapter 15 Public Administration

Data on the levels, patterns and distribution of the income and expenditure of local government units (LGUs) and ranking of their competitiveness are essential in measuring their capabilities to provide public service to their constituents. Specifically, the level of income serves as a criterion in the classification of LGUs. The classification, on the other hand, provides a yardstick in the allocation of resources and other forms of assistance. The data provide a sound and logical basis in the choice of alternative options aimed at balancing the sources and disposition of resources. The data are also useful in identifying priority program areas and localities in the community. Furthermore, their capabilities are measured and awarded to stir their performance based on the 4 pilars; Economic Dynamism, Government Efficiency, Infrastructure and Resiliency

This chapter presents data on the statement of income and expenditure of local governments. The Bureau of Local Government Finance of the Department of Finance provides the said data. The Bureau of Internal Revenue, on the other hand, provided data on internal revenue collections of LGUs. Data on the number of precincts and registered voters from the Commission on Elections are also presented. The Metropolitan Manila Development Authority provides data on road accidents, flood and garbage. In addition, the National Competitiveness Council is the one who assess and provide the data of Cities/Municipalities Competitiveness Index also known as CMCI.

HIGHLIGHTS

- City of Makati has the highest internal revenue collection in 2016.
- During May 9, 2016, City of Valenzuela has the highest voter turnout with 84 percent of the registered voters.
- In 2017, Quezon City top as the most overall competitive highly urbanized city in the Philippines, followed by the City of Manila and Davao City respectively.



Chapter 16 Money and Banking

Data pertaining to the operations of financial institutions provide indicators of the area's economy. The growth in the number of banking institutions operating in a certain locality gives insights on the pace at which business and trade grows. Data on loans granted by banks provide a picture of the level and nature of investments put up over time. Statistics on loans outstanding of financial institutions, on the other hand, serve as signals of the rate of turnover of investments. The money and banking sector plays a vital in development of productive activities by proprietors or corporate institutions in the area. The presence and accessibility of establishments providing these services to existing and prospective investors contribute to the realization of programs and projects aimed at industrial and entrepreneurial advancement.

his chapter presents data on the number of offices of the financial system in the region, loan portfolio, operating and interest income and interest expenses by type of banks. The source of data is the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

HIGHLIGHTS

- As of 30 September 2016, the City of Makati generated the most total interest income in NCR with almost seven times higher than the next highest, the City of Manila.
- From 2007 to 2015, NCR's total interest income is continuously decreasing.
- City of Makati has the only increasing total interest income among other city/municipality in NCR from year 2007 to 2015.



 \mathcal{D} ata on public order, safety and justice reflect the effectiveness, efficiency and fairness in the administration and enforcement of laws. The basic goal of the government is to establish a peaceful, stable and just environment conducive to national growth and development. A society where peace, order and law prevail is not only a goal or a vision. It forms one of the pillars of man's basic rights. Development that is not coupled with order, safety and justice contribute to the degradation of society. The effects of public order, safety and justice in national well-being and in every fiber of the social and economic lives of individuals are priority concerns of governance. In this light, an information system that generates timely and reliable data becomes necessary tool in the administration of justice and enforcement of laws as well as to aid legislation.

This chapter presents regional and provincial data on crimes, number of policemen and firemen, and fire incidences, including deaths, injuries and property damages. The sources of data are the Philippine National Police for data on crimes and law enforcers and the Bureau of Fire Protection-NCR for fire incidences and fire personnel.

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2016, solution rate of crime incidence increased by 12.0% from year 2015.
- Number of crime incidence decreased by 6.9% in 2016 compare to 2015.
- Quezon City has the highest fire incidence among city/municipalities in 2016.







The use of the data pertaining to region's science and technology area is to further strengthen our competitiveness in developing scientific products for domestic consumption and for global competition. Policies and projects in line with this will include statistical data to help our policy makers improve our science and technology department.

This chapter presents data on the number of Research and Development (R & D) personnel and the Research and Development Expenditures (RDE) in the Philippines and NCR, as well as the ratio of RDE to total income of NCR. The source of data is Department of Science and Technology and Philippine Statistics Authority.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The total number of Research and Development Personnel in the Philippines reached to 36,517. Most of them are in the private industries.
- Out of 36,517 Research and Development personnel in the country, 26,495 of them are researchers.
- Meanwhile in NCR, there were 13,107 Research and Development personnel. About 66.4 percent were also in the private industries.
