OVERVIEW OF THE CITY OF MARIKINA

History

The Augustinians were the first to arrive at the Marikina Valley in 1500, at the spot known as “Chorillo” in Barangka. Next came the Jesuits in 1630, in a place now called Jesus dela Peña (Jesus of the Rocks). Here, the Jesuits established a mission and built a chapel.

In 1687, this pueblo became a parish known as Mariquina. In 1901, with the coming of the Americans, its name officially became Marikina. The early settlers lived along the riverbanks and nearby fertile farms. With the industry of the natives, combined with the know-how of the early Chinese settlers, the farms began to produce rice and vegetables in great quantities until the valley became part of the country’s most prized hacienda.

By the 19th century, Hacienda Marikina was owned and administered by the Tuazon family and had become the biggest in the Philippines. For its massive size, natural beauty, and plentiful harvest, the hacienda was declared a mayorazgo (royal estate) by the Spanish colonial government. At one time, the estate was administered by the beautiful native lass, Doña Teresa dela Paz, who was married to scion of the Tuazon family.

In 1887, Marikina’s shoemaking industry began through the pioneering efforts of Don Laureano “Kapitan Moy” Guevarra, assisted by Tiburcio Eustaquio, Ambrocio Sta. Ines, and Gervacio Carlos. Kapitan Moy’s worn-out pair of British shoes provided the creative spark: he took the shoes apart, painstakingly studied their components, and then made patterns out of them. After keenly observing the Chinese in Parian, Manila, he fashioned his own pair of shoes. With crude tools, raw materials, and the villagers’ support, Kapitan Moy subsequently mastered the art of shoemaking.

By the turn of the 20th century, Marikina emerged as a town of shoemakers. Honed by years in shoe manufacturing, the natives quickly developed a work ethic that had prepared them for the arrival of heavy industries in the 1950s. With the proliferation of industrial plants came waves of workers who had chosen to stay, rapidly increasing the population. In no time, shoe manufacturing flourished into a multi-million-peso industry, earning for Marikina the moniker, “Shoe Capital of the Philippines”.

For the next three decades, Marikina would grow helter-skelter, a victim of runaway growth. Not until 1992 would it be able to turn a corner and reserved the trend under new leadership.

On 11 June 1901, Marikina was incorporated in the newly created Province of Rizal by Act. No. 137 of the Philippine Commission. In 1975, when the Metro Manila Commission was created under Presidential Decree No. 824, integrating four cities and 13 towns majority of which were in the province of Rizal, Marikina became part of Metropolitan Manila area.

Marikina soon became a victim of its own growth, creating a slew of problems. One of these was the deterioration of the Marikina River, which resulted from the reckless behavior of factories and squatter colonies that lined the banks.

Marikina jumpstarted its efforts toward recovery and renewal in 1992. Guided by a vision of creating a modern and livable city, it has successfully laid the foundation of a flourishing community.

On December 8, 1996. Marikina was proclaimed a city through Republic Act 8223. Marikina has since transformed itself from a backward community into one that boasts thriving economy and hardworking, tenacious and disciplined citizens.

Today, Marikina is a multi-awarded city, often lauded for its vibrant business life, highly skilled workforce, and a responsive local government that puts a premium on governance, sustainable urban development and public service.

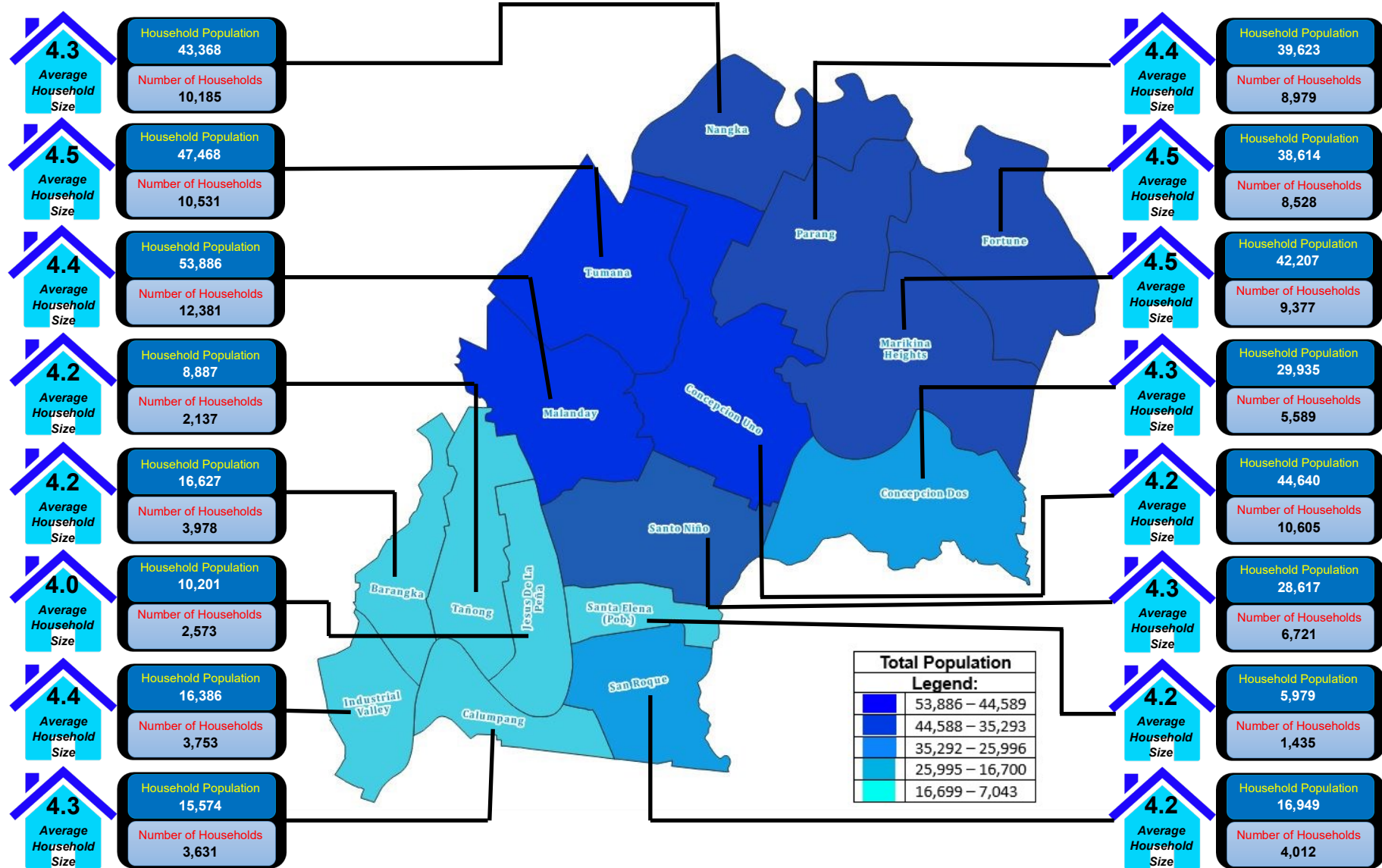

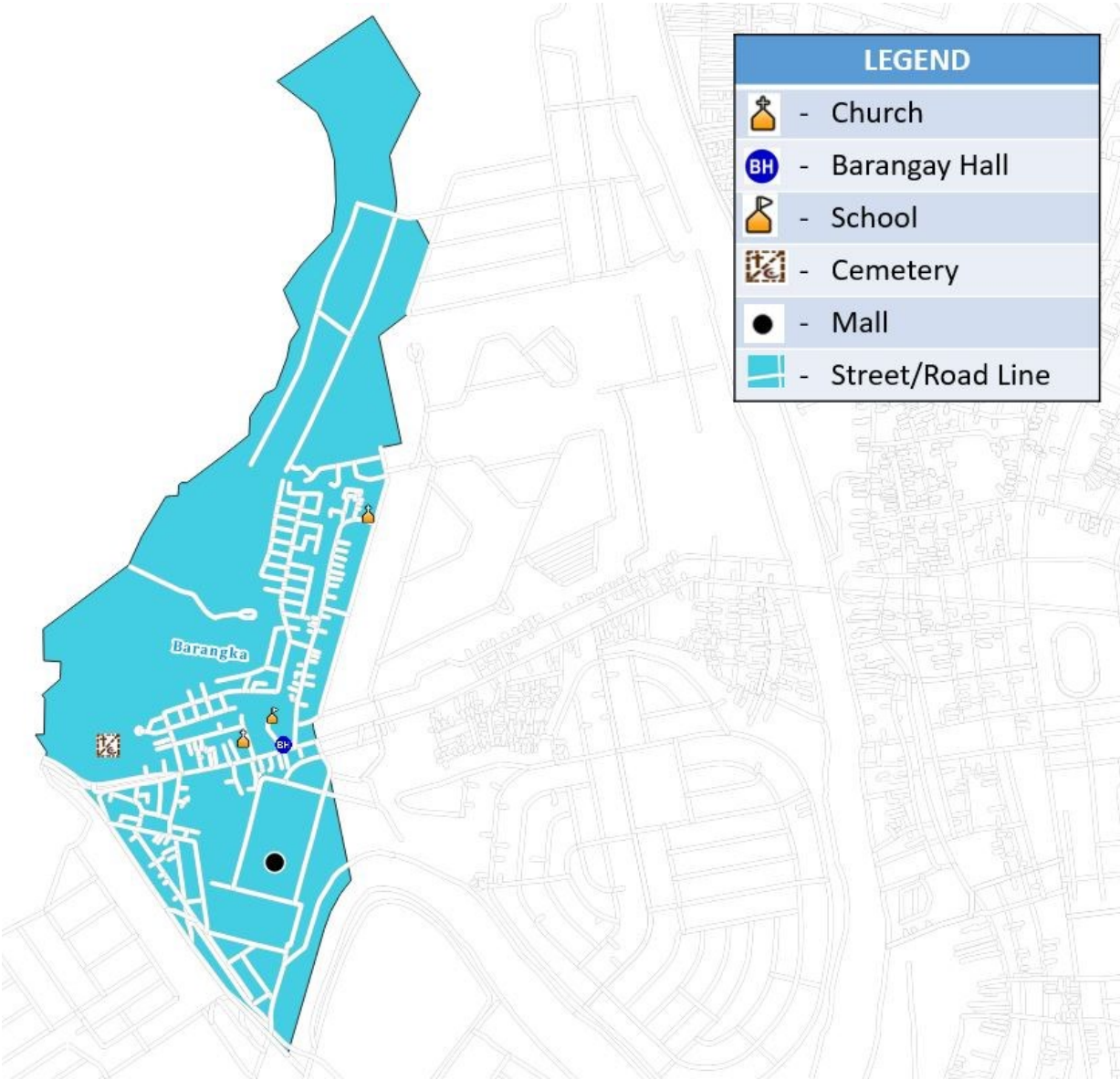
Map of the City of Marikina

2024 Countryside in Figures: City of Marikina



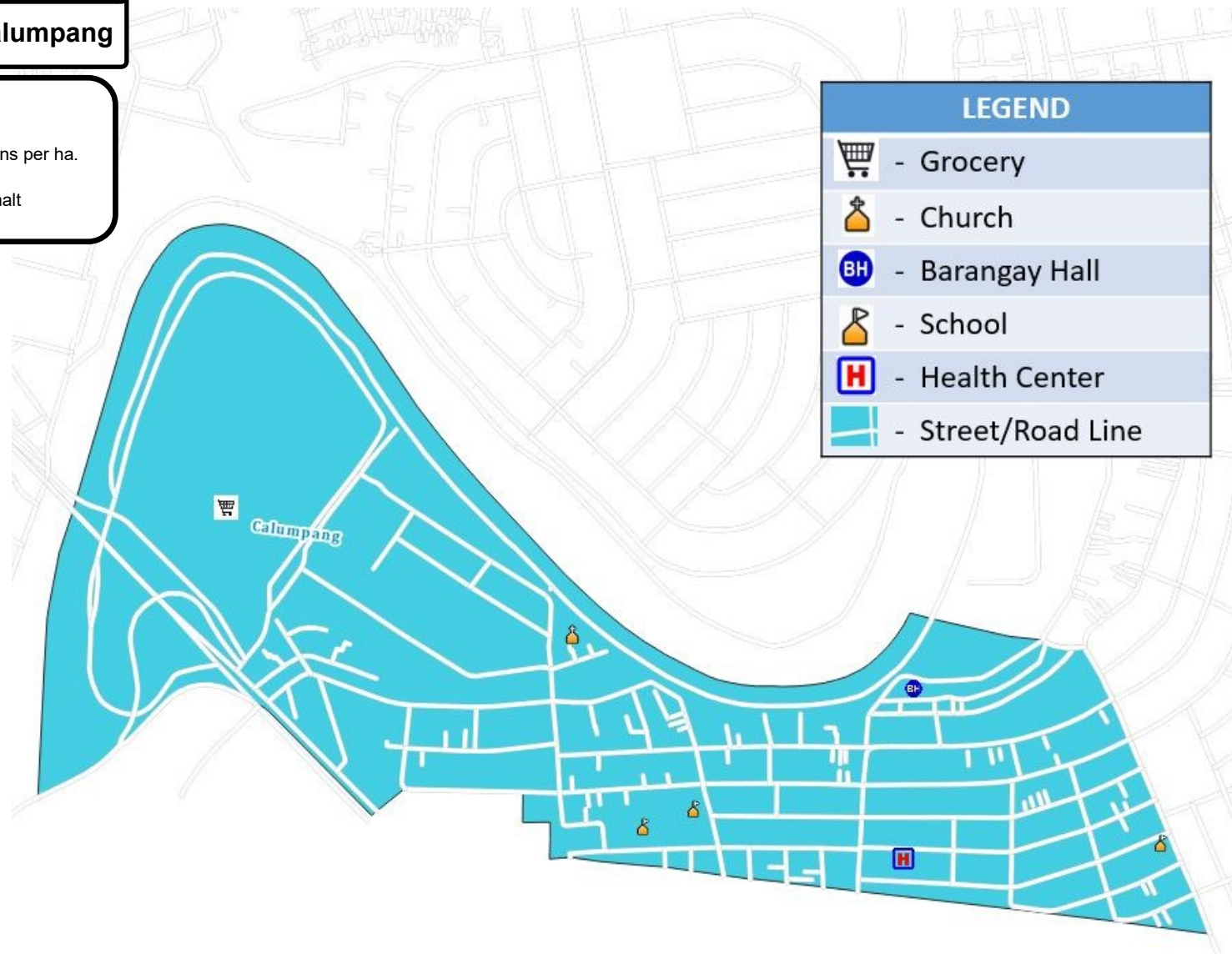
Map of Barangay Barangka

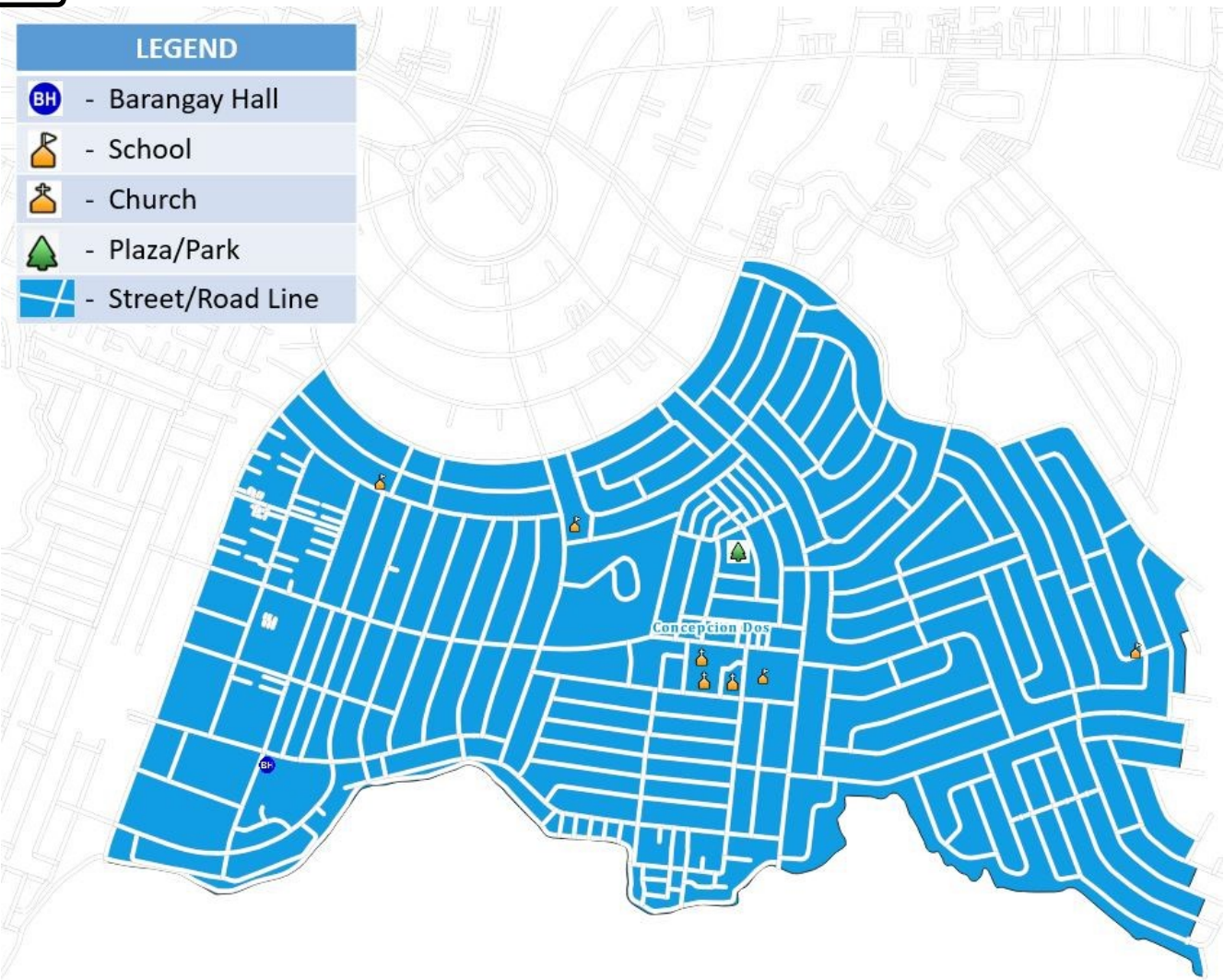
Map of Barangay Calumpang

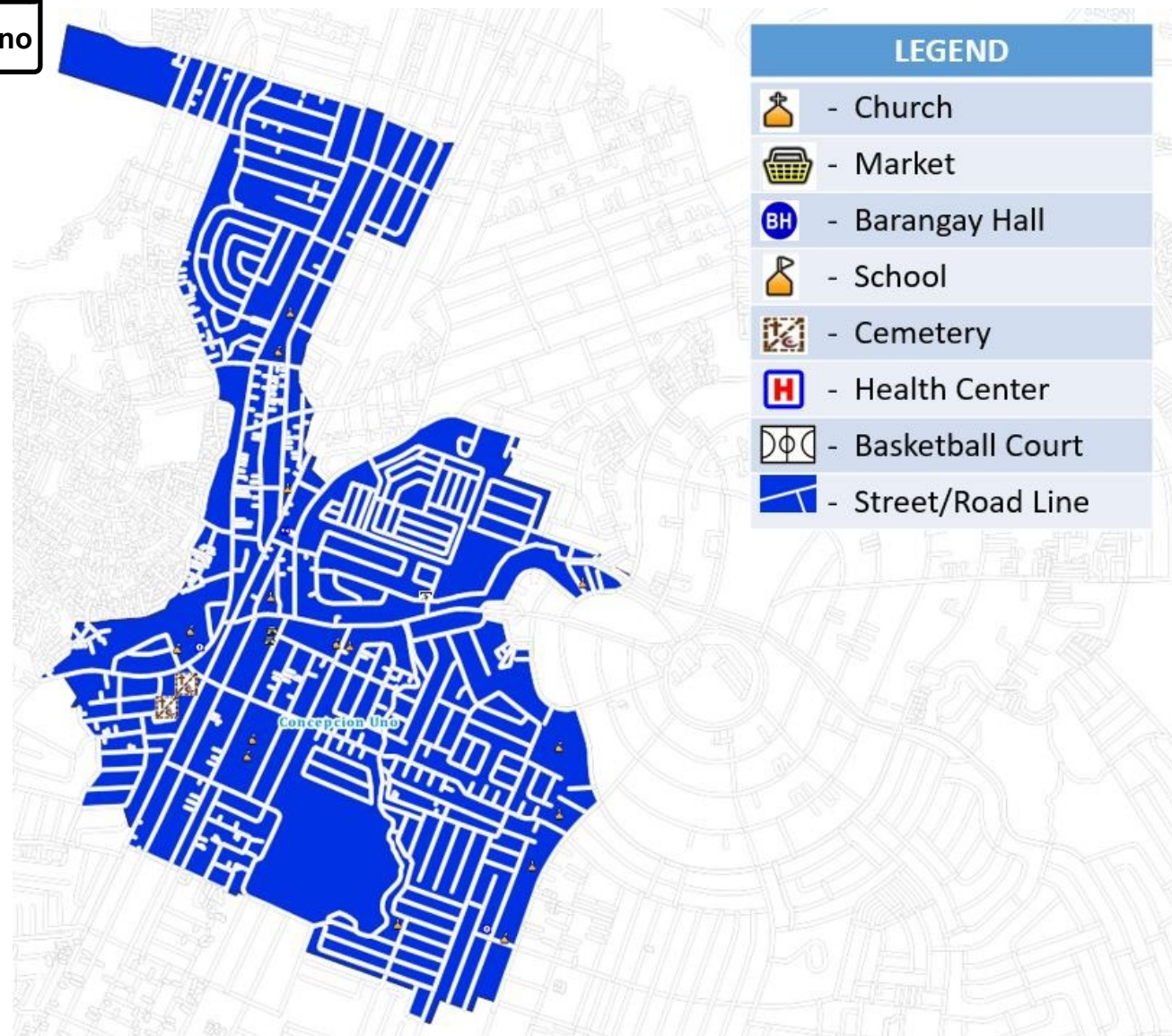
Map of Barangay Concepcion Dos

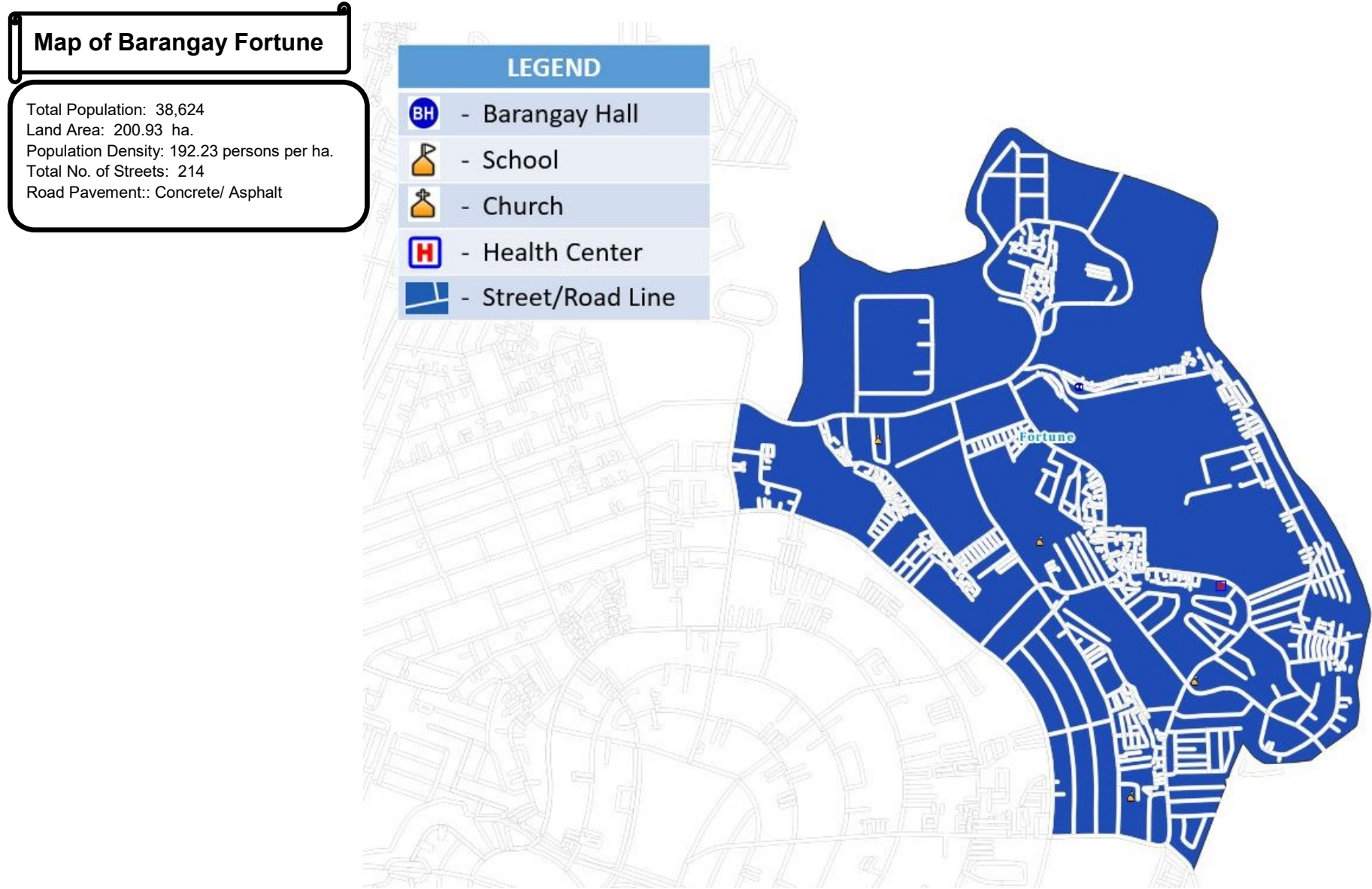

Map of Barangay Concepcion Uno

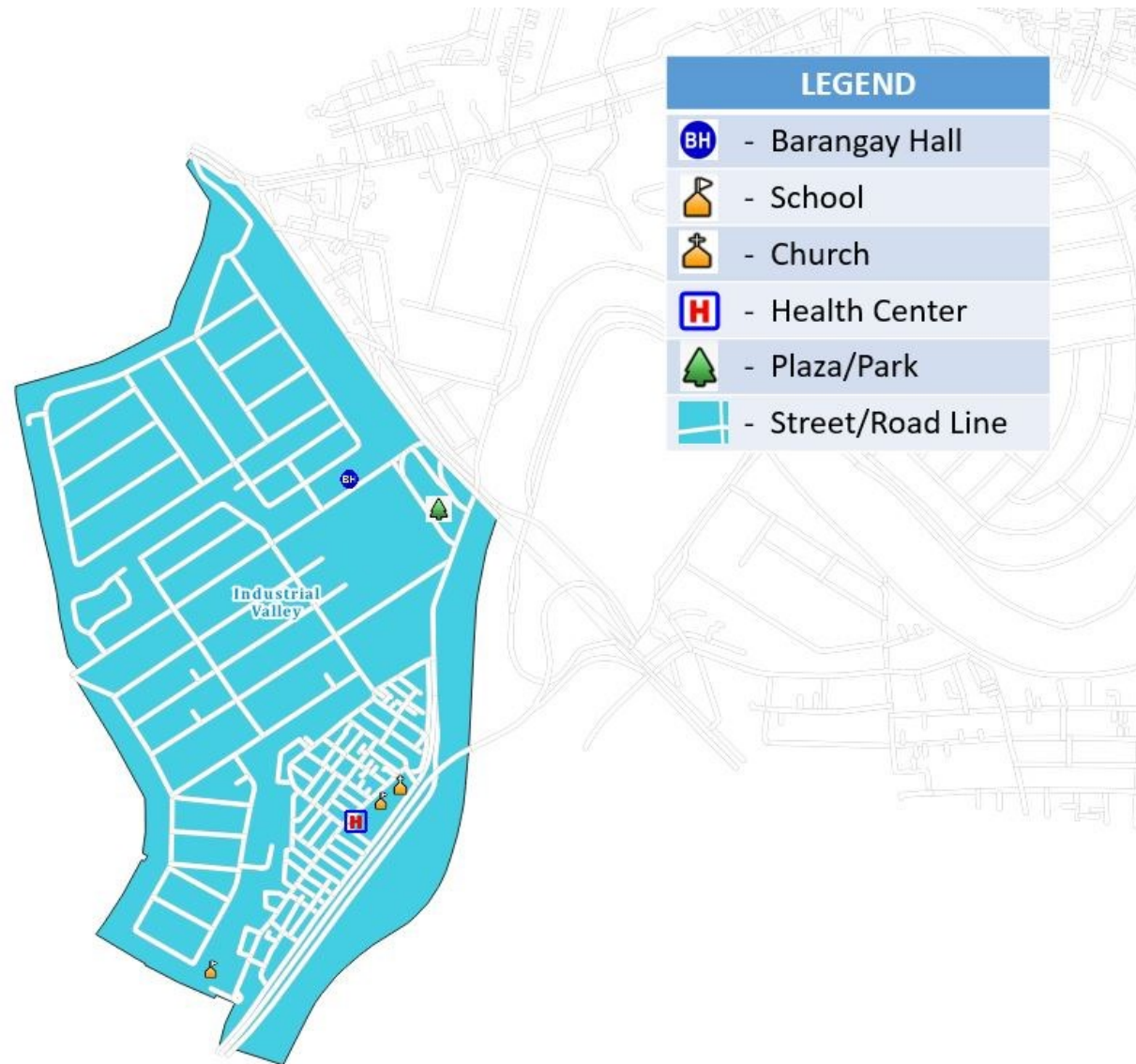

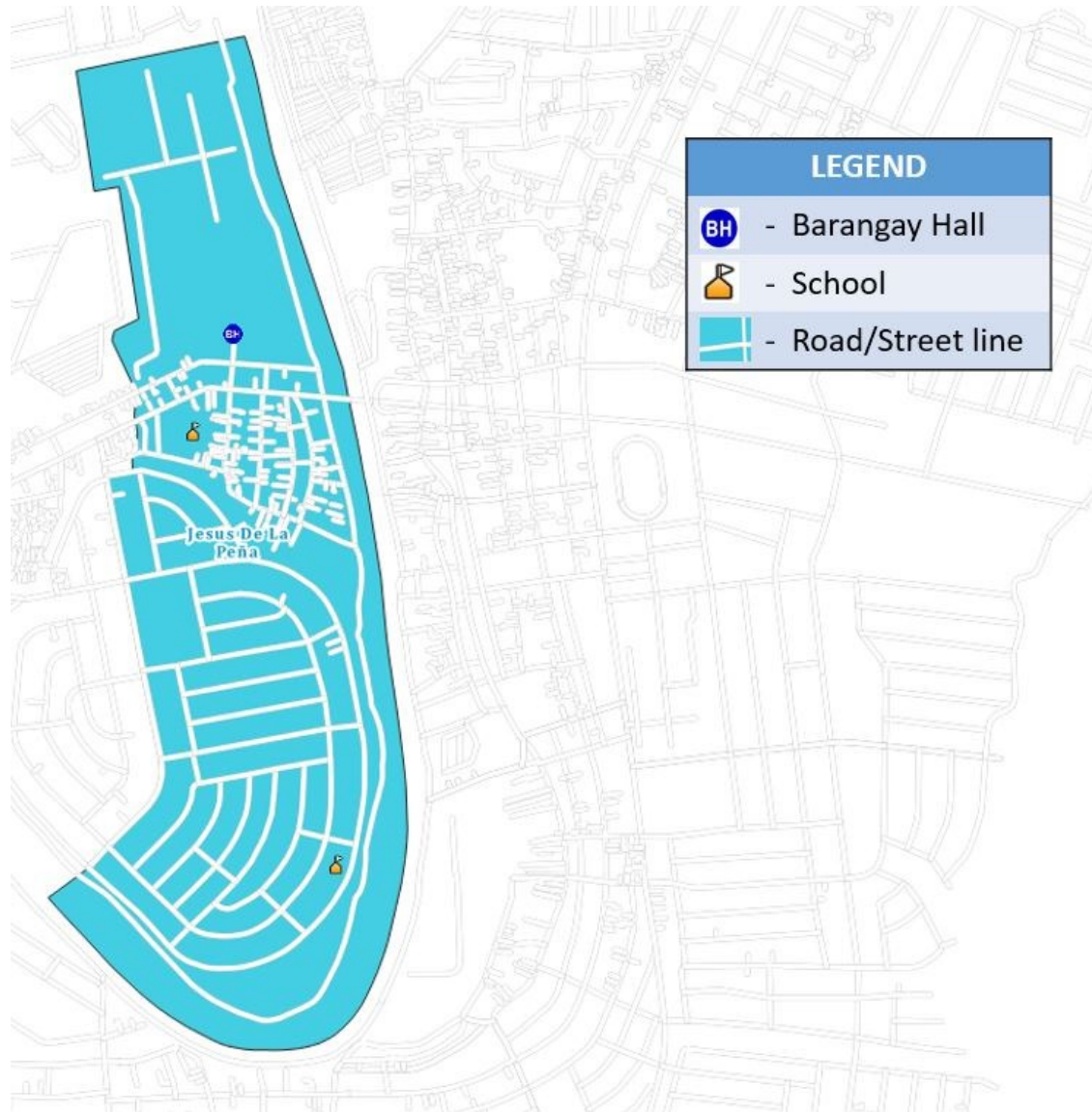
Map of Barangay Industrial Valley

Map of Barangay Malanday

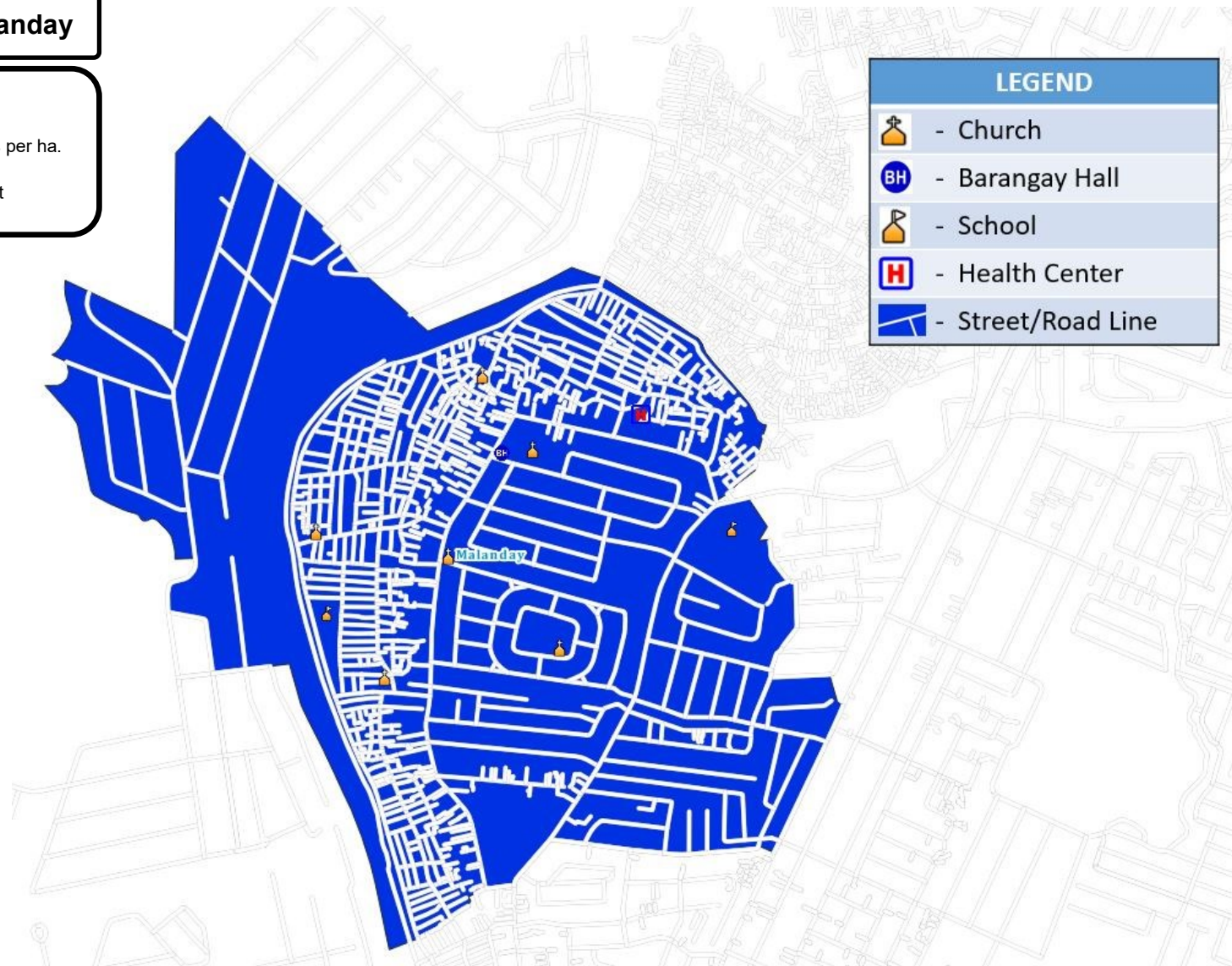

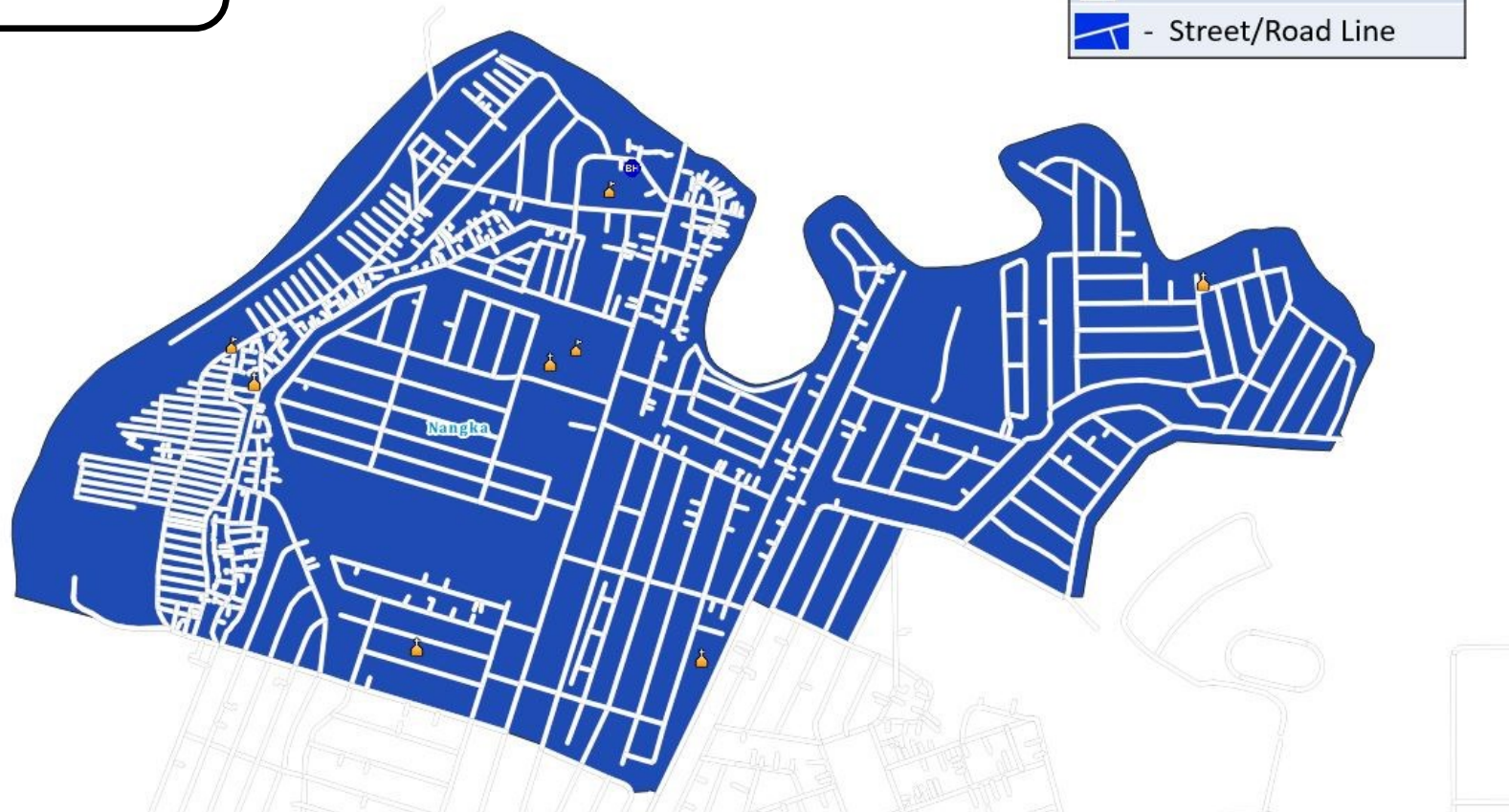


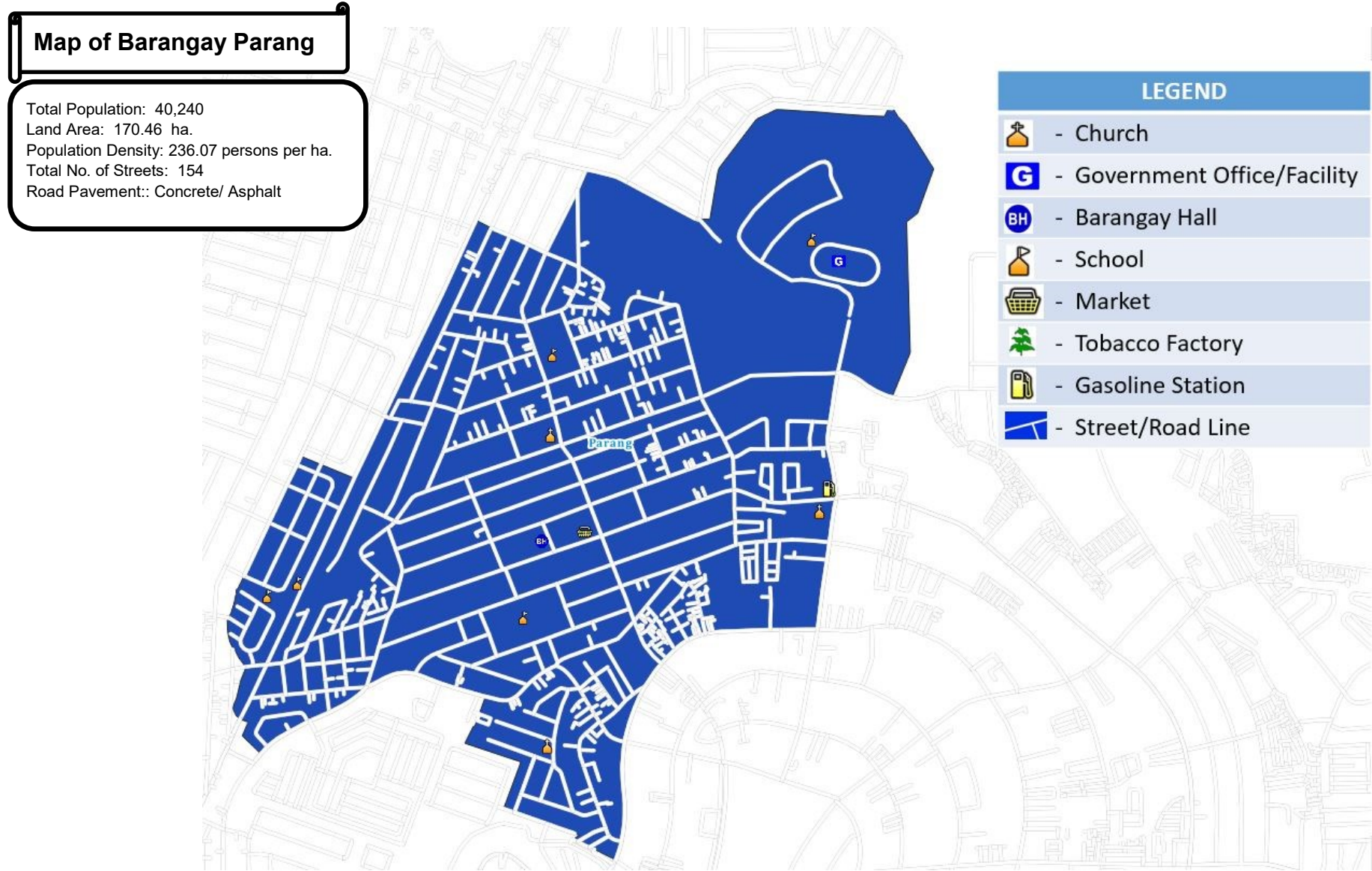


Map of Barangay Nangka

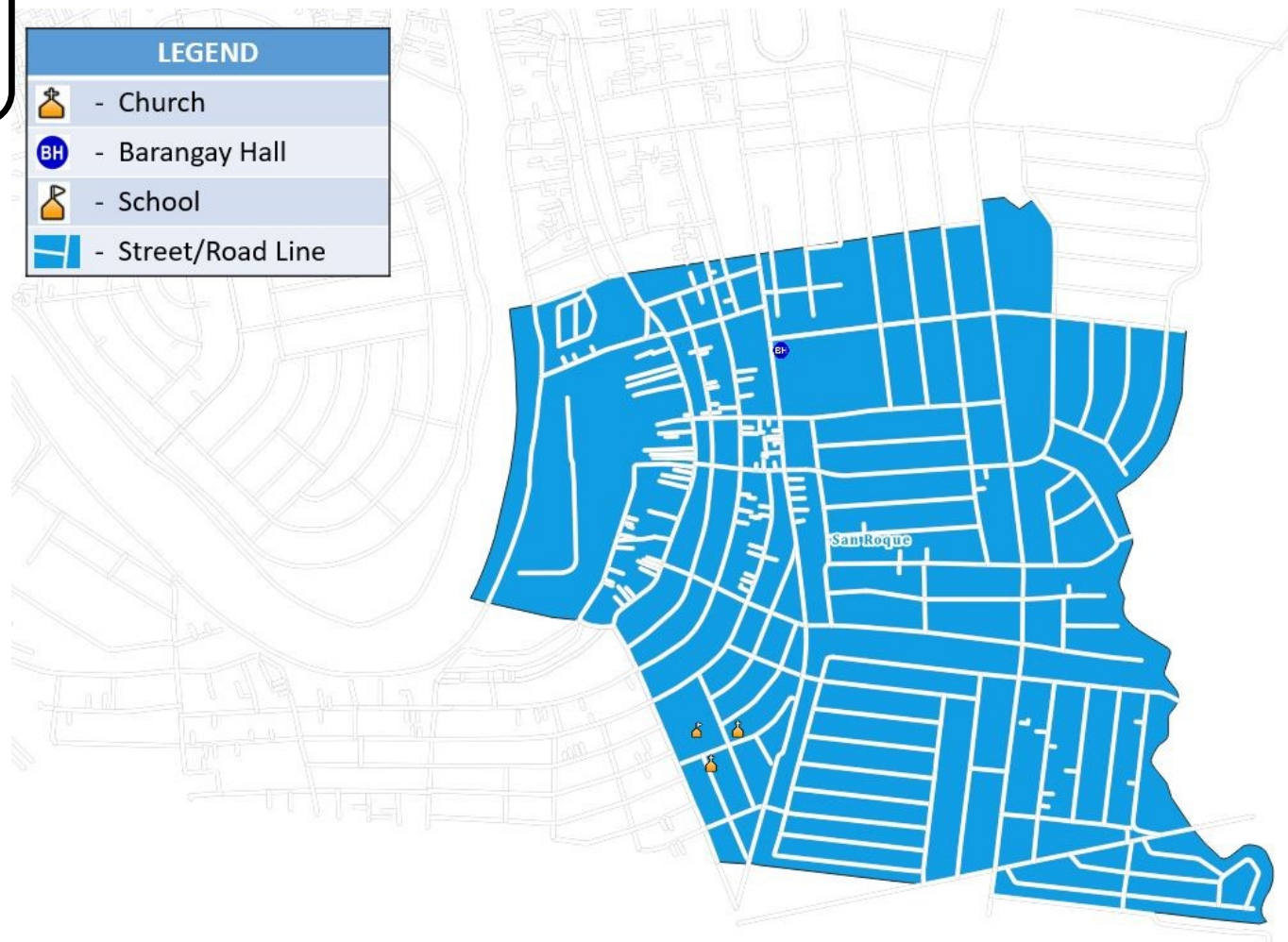




Map of Barangay San Roque

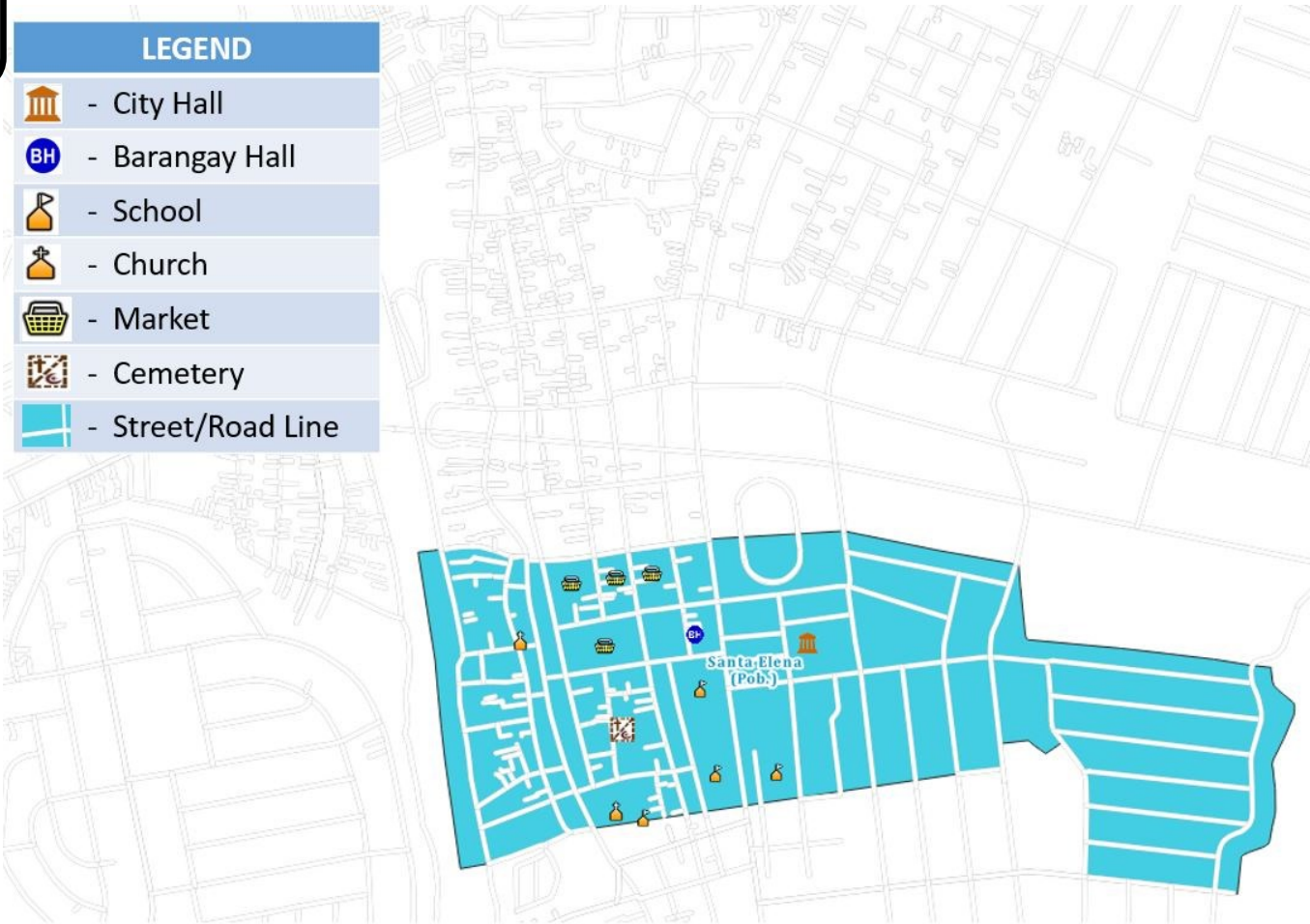

Map of Barangay Santa Elena

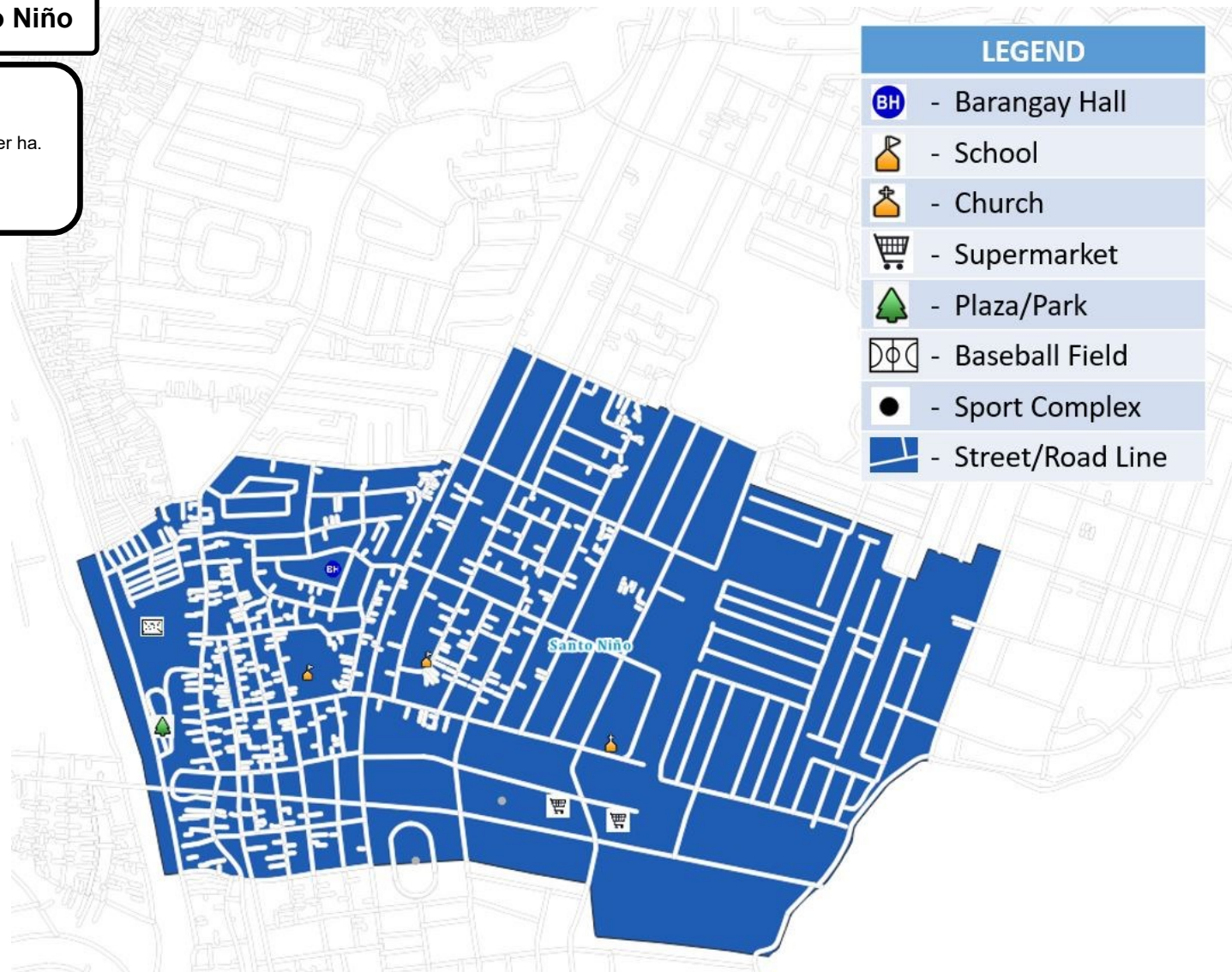

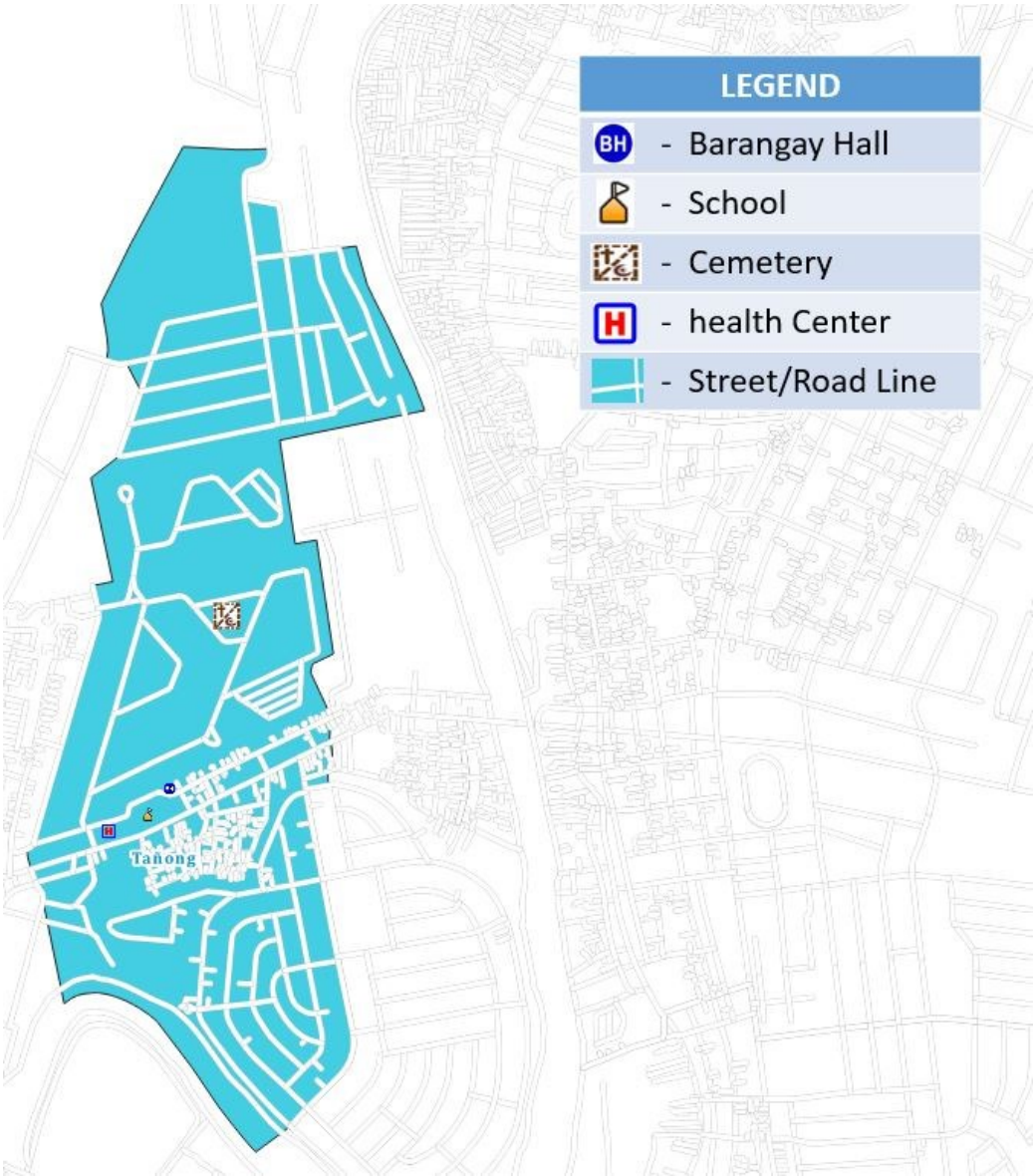
Map of Barangay Santo Niño

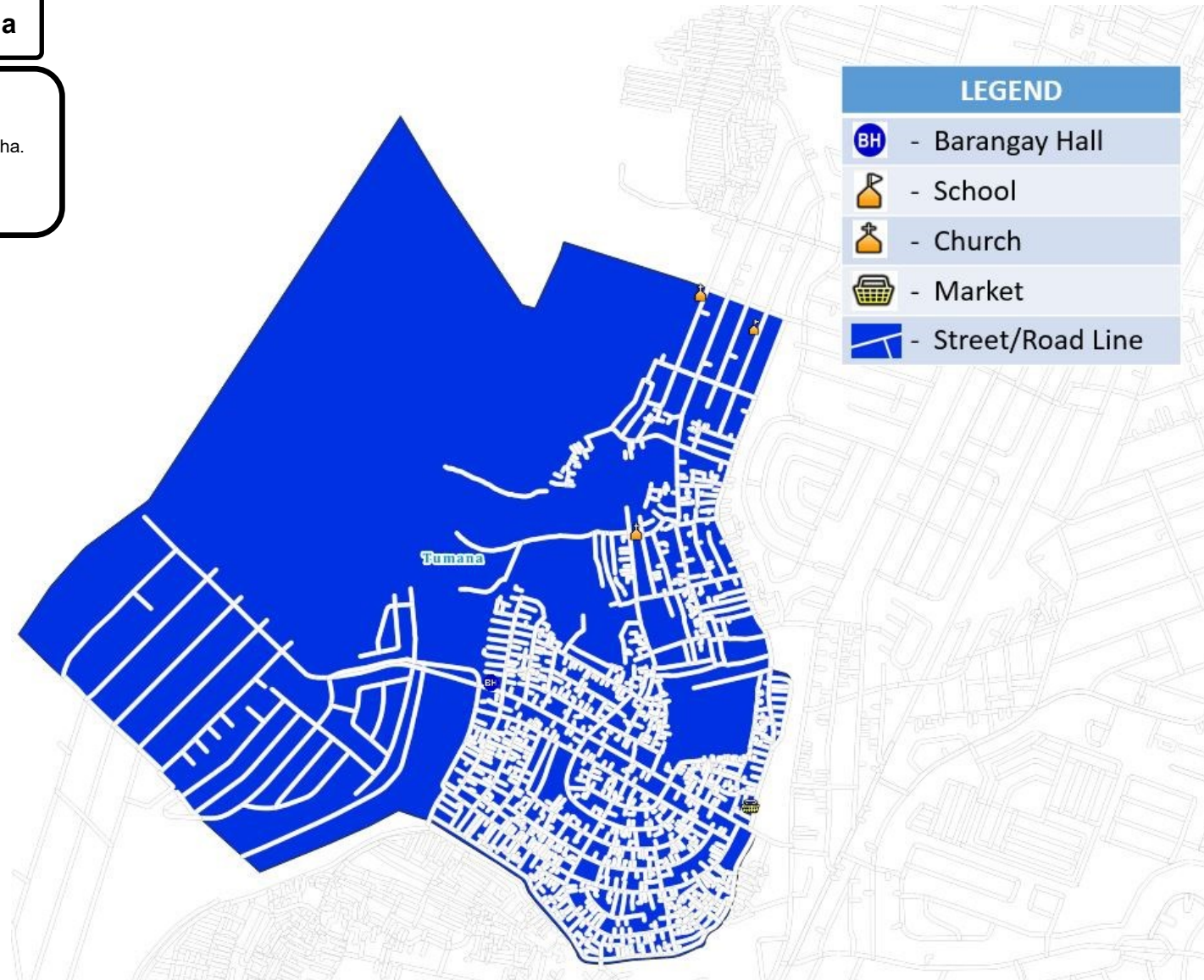
Map of Barangay Tañong

CHAPTER 1

POPULATION

HIGHLIGHTS

- The City of Marikina exhibited a total population of 456,059, with a household population of 452,961, in 2020. The city had a household population of 452,961 from 104,415 households, resulting in an average household size of 4.3.
- In 2020, the city had a sex ratio of 96, indicating a slight prevalence of females in the population. This ratio remains consistent with the 2015 ratio of 95, suggesting that the distribution of sexes has remained relatively stable over time.
- Throughout all age groups, the female household population consistently outnumbered the male household population in 2020.
- In 2020, the city had an age dependency ratio of 48 which implies that for every 100 working-age individuals, there were about 48 dependents. The age dependency rate was higher for males than for females, by 3 points; males had a 49, while females had a 46.
- Between 2020 and 2015, the age dependency ratios for both younger and older dependents saw a general decrease.
- Most of the household population, or 98.0 percent, was registered at birth. However, 1.1 percent of the household population was not registered. A very small proportion, 0.1 percent, indicated they "Don't Know" their birth registration status.
- Out of 447.5 thousand birth registered household population in the city, 443.6 thousand or 99.1 percent were able to secure a copy of their birth certificate.
- Of the 560 foreign citizens residing in the city in 2020, 177 or 31.6 percent were United States citizens, 79 or 14.1 percent were Chinese citizens, and 65 or 11.6 percent were Indian citizens.
- Of the household population in the city, Roman Catholic was the most widespread religious affiliation, accounting for roughly 23.7 million people or 88.4 percent.

CHAPTER 2

VITAL STATISTICS

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2022, the number of live births occurred in the City of Marikina exceeded births to mothers residing in the city by 1,229.
- On the average, 15 births were born to mothers residing in the city every day.
- More male babies (51.2%) were born than females (48.8%). This translates to 105 male babies per 100 female babies.
- Six in every 100 births were born to teenage mothers residing in the City of Marikina aged 19 years old and below.
- More than 600 (12.3%) babies were below the average normal birth weight.
- Most marriages occurred in December with 223 or 13.5 percent.
- Sixty-one Filipino women and six Filipino men found love and married a foreign national.
- The number of deaths among male residents of City of Marikina is higher than females.
- January and October recorded the highest number of deaths with more than 300 deaths.
- Approximately six in every 10 deaths were medically attended.
- The top cause of death among residents of the city is Acute Myocardial Infarction, also known as “heart attack.”

GOVERNANCE

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2023, the Department of Trade and Industry recently reported that the City of Marikina improved its ranking in terms of infrastructure and resiliency. It rose from rank 29 to 23 in infrastructure and rank 26 to 25 in resiliency.
- According to the 2022 Annual Audit Report from the Commission on Audit, the City of Marikina experienced a 5.4 percent increase in its government equity from 2021 to 2022.
- The amount of revenue in the city had an insignificant minority or 3.9 percent rise from approximately PhP 3.48 billion in 2021 to PhP 3.62 billion in 2022.

CHAPTER 4

HEALTH

HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2023, Marikina had 17 City Health Centers, however the number of public health personnel dropped from 268 in 2021 to 251. This decline highlights potential challenges in public health service delivery and staffing in the city.
- The number of pregnant women who received a Hepa B1 vaccine had moderate increase of 22.8 percent from 2022 to 2023. This rise suggests improved vaccination efforts and potentially greater awareness of the importance of maternal health.
- The City of Marikina offers comprehensive healthcare benefits for pregnant women, including prenatal check-ups, Tetanus Diphtheria vaccines, Iron with Folic Acid, Calcium Carbonate supplementation, and deworming tablets. Notably, there was a 27.5 percent increase in the number of pregnant women who completed their deworming doses from 2022 to 2023, reflecting improved access to and utilization of these essential health services.
- As of 2023, a total of 3,006 pregnant women in the City of Marikina were screened for Hepatitis B. Notably, the number of those who tested positive decreased by 59.3% compared to 2022, indicating significant progress in managing and preventing the disease among pregnant women in the city.

CHAPTER 5

INCOME & EXPENDITURES

HIGHLIGHTS

- The average annual income of Filipino families in the City of Marikina in 2023 was estimated at PhP 556.55 thousand. This was higher by 15.2 percent from the PhP 482.95 thousand average family income in 2021. Moreover, the average annual family income in 2018 was recorded at PhP 475.24 thousand.
- Meanwhile, Filipino families in the City of Marikina spent an average of PhP 451.14 thousand in 2023, a rebound of 22.3 percent compared to the PhP 368.75 thousand expenditure in 2021. In 2018, the average annual family expenditure was registered at PhP 392.76 thousand.
- The poverty incidence among families and among population in 2023 was recorded at 0.7 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively.

CHAPTER 6

EDUCATION

HIGHLIGHTS

- The data in Table 6.1 reveals a significant difference of 29,001 enrollees between government and private elementary schools for the school year 2023-2024.
- For the school year 2023-2024, a total of 5,685 students are enrolled in public preschool programs in the City of Marikina. Notably, Malanday Elementary School has the highest enrollment with 690 students, followed by Nangka Elementary School with 537 students. In contrast, Industrial Valley Elementary School has the lowest enrollment, with only 139 students.
- At Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Marikina, there were a total of 9,095 college and graduate students. Among them, 3,794 are male students, making up 41.7 percent of the students, while 5,301 are female students, accounting for 58.3 percent.

CHAPTER 7

LABOR & EMPLOYMENT

HIGHLIGHTS

- The estimated number of persons in the labor force in 2022 increased to 214 persons from 203 persons in 2021. This is equivalent to a 2.8 percent labor force participation rate.
- The unemployment rate decreased to 8.3 percent in 2022 from 12.9 percent in 2021 in the City of Marikina. This means that there were about 18 thousand unemployed Filipinos aged 15 years and over in 2022.

CHAPTER 9

BANKING & FINANCE

HIGHLIGHTS

- From 2023 to 2024, the City of Marikina experienced a marginal decrease in the number of banks, resulting in a total of 88.
- The City of Marikina had 189 automated teller machines (ATMs) in 2023, a little decline from 2022. This figure comprises 171 from universal and commercial banks, as well as 18 from thrift banks, demonstrating the continuous emphasis on residents' banking accessibility.
- The amount of loans in the City of Marikina decreased by 19.1 percent from PhP 16,709.86 million in 2023 to PhP 13,512.56 million in 2024.

CHAPTER 10

INFRASTRUCTURE

HIGHLIGHTS

- The value of residential building construction declined by PhP 88,949.24 or just under a half from first quarter of 2022 to first quarter of 2023.
- As shown in Table 10.5, the data illustrates a significant increase in the number, floor area and value of building construction in factory and repair machine shop during first quarter of 2023.
- The value of non-residential building construction ascends by PhP 269,776.26 from second quarter of 2022 to second quarter of 2023.
- Building construction from third quarter of 2022 to 2023 decreased from 101 to 62. Similarly, the value of construction dropped by 31.2 percent.
- The data indicates that residential buildings registered a total of 221 of building construction in the City of Marikina throughout the year of 2023. Likewise, second quarter of 2023 being the highest with 32.6 percent of the total, followed by fourth quarter of 2023 with 25.3 percent, then third quarter with 24.0 percent and first quarter with 18.1 percent.
- In 2023, the City of Marikina registered a total of 221 residential building constructions. The data indicates that the second quarter had the highest portion, totaling to 32.6 percent of the all residential building constructions. This was followed by the fourth quarter at 25.3 percent, the third quarter at 24.0 percent, and the first quarter at 18.1 percent. This trend highlights a significant peak in residential construction during the second quarter of the year.

CHAPTER 11

PUBLIC ORDER

HIGHLIGHTS

- In the City of Marikina, the number of road accidents increased significantly by 22.7 percent when comparing the years 2022 and 2023. This rise indicates a concerning trend in road safety that may require further investigation and potential interventions.
- A total of 4,048 road accidents were recorded in the City of Marikina as of 2023. Thus, accidents through damage or destruction to properties had the bigger portion of 2,554 or 63.1 percent.
- In 2023, the city reported 4,048 road accidents. Property damage occurrences accounted for the most, with 2,554 cases, or 63.1 percent of all road accidents.
- The volume of garbage disposal reduced by 133,798.04 cubic meters from 2021 to 2022.
- The City of Marikina recorded a total of 781 crimes as of 2023. The top three crime offenses identified by the Marikina City Police Station were the following: Violation of R.A. 9165 or the Anti-illegal drugs, Theft/Carnapping, and Robbery—with over 100 crimes offenses.
- The City of Marikina registered 155 fire incidents in 2023, with two casualties due to vehicle fires. Additionally, these vehicular fires caused an estimated property damage valued at approximately PhP 25,090,000.00, highlighting the significant impact of such incidents.

CHAPTER 13

TRANSPORTATION

HIGHLIGHTS

- The data analysis reveals a substantial rise in registered public utility jeepney, with a 66.4 percent increase over the year of 2023.
- Out of 1,521 jeepney vehicles in the City of Marikina, 959 units of these were registered in the Barangay Santo Niño as of 28 February 2024.
- In 2024, the City of Marikina recorded 4,992 tricycles for hire out of 8,743 registered vehicles. Consequently, the number of registered tricycles for hire increased significantly of 2.9 percent between 2023 and 2024.
- In the City of Marikina, Barangay Santo Niño leads with the highest number of registered vehicles, totaling 1,902 units. Following it are Barangay Marikina Heights with 718 registered vehicles and Barangay Fortune with 619 units. Notably, Barangay Jesus Dela Peña reported no registered vehicles. This data highlights the varying levels of vehicle registration across the barangays in the city.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Addition - refers to any new construction which increases the height or area of an existing building/structure.

Age Dependency Ratio - refers to the ratio of persons in the "dependent" ages (generally under age 15 and over age 64) to those in the "economically productive" ages (15-64 years) in the population. It is sometimes divided into the old-age dependency (the ratio of people aged 65 and older to those aged 15-64 years) and the child dependency (ratio of people under 15 to those aged 15-64 years).

Alteration - is a construction in a building/structure involving changes in the materials used, partitioning and location/size of openings, structural parts, existing utilities and equipment but does not increase the overall area thereof.

Anemia - a condition in which the number of red blood cells or the hemoglobin concentration within them is lower than normal.

Apartment - is a structure, usually of two stories, made up of independent living quarters, with independent entrances from internal walls and courts.

Assets - refers to resources including land owned and/or controlled by the establishment as a result of past transactions and events from which future economic benefits are expected to flow to the establishments.

Barangay - the smallest political unit in the country.

Barangay Health Station - a basic, first-hand health care facility. In the grassroot level, it can cater vital health services to the community. It has numerous purposes, serving different populations.

Child Protected at Birth (CPB) - refers to a child whose mother has received 2 doses of TT during this pregnancy, provided TT2 was given at least a month prior to delivery, or mother has received at least 3 doses of TT any time prior to pregnancy with this child.

City Health Center - city-based and patient-directed health centers that deliver comprehensive, culturally competent, high-quality primary health care services.

City and Municipality Competitiveness Index (CMCI) - refers to the rankings of cities and municipalities based on the sum of their scores on four Pillars: Economic Dynamism, Government Efficiency, Infrastructure, and Resiliency.

City Health Center - city-based and patient-directed health centers that deliver comprehensive, culturally competent, high-quality primary health care services.

Civil Registration - refers to the recording in the appropriate civil registers, vital acts and events that affect the civil status of individuals.

Civil Status - refers to the legal status of a contracting party with reference to the marriage laws or customs of his/her country.

Commercial Banks - can handle your regular financial needs. They accept deposits, allow withdrawals, offer checking account and loan services, and have products like savings accounts and certificates of deposit. Both individuals and organizations are the usual customers of such banks.

Commercial Buildings - refer to office buildings and all buildings which are intended for use primarily in wholesale, retail and service trades; i.e. stores, hotels, restaurants, banks, disco houses, etc.

Completely Immunized Children (CIC) - a child 12 to 23 months of age who received 1 dose of BCG, 3 doses each of OPV, DPT, Hepatitis B and 1 dose of anti-Measles vaccine.

Cooperative Banks - are organized or owned by cooperatives or federation of cooperatives. Cooperative banks can also be a big help for farmers looking for financial services and solutions

Crime Volume - is the number of crime incidents committed in a given area over a period of time which include the index and non-index crimes.

Crimes - include felonies which are violations of the Revised Penal Code and offenses which are violations of special laws. For statistical purposes, only crimes reported to authorities are covered.

Crude Birth Rate - is the ratio of the number of births during a specified period (e.g., one year) to the total number of persons in the mid-period population or July 1 of the same year.

Current Assets - refers to short-term assets; those that can be liquidated quickly and used for an entity's immediate needs. Noncurrent assets are long-term and have a useful life of more than a year.

Current Liabilities - refers to short-term financial obligations that are due within one year or within a normal operating cycle.

Daily Average - refers to the arithmetic mean of vital occurrences per day.

Death - refers to the permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place (postnatal cessation of vital functions without capability of resuscitation).

Duplex House - is a structure intended for two households, with complete living facilities for each; it is a single structure divided into two dwelling units by a wall extending from the floor to the ceiling

Economic Dynamism - usually associated with activities that create stable expansion of business and industries and higher employment. This is the concrete representation of productivity as it matches the output of the local economy with local resources. Conceptually, it is the combination of the entrepreneurial spirit and the financial institutions that will channel dynamism (Edmund Phelps). It is recognized that localities are the centers of economic activities. Therefore, business expansion and job creation are easily observable in local settings.

Elementary Education - typically the first stage of formal education, coming after preschool/kindergarten and before secondary school.

Employment Rate - percentage of the total number of employed persons to the total number of persons in the labor force.

Equity - represents the value that would be returned to an entity's shareholders if all of the assets were liquidated and all of the company's debts were paid off. We can also think of equity as a degree of residual ownership in a firm or asset after subtracting all debts associated with that asset.

Family Income - refers to the average income of the family. Family incomes includes primary income (earnings) and receipts from the other sources received by all family members as participants in any economic activities, either laborer, proprietor, capitalist or entrepreneur, or as recipients of transfers, pensions, grants and others.

Fatalities - an occurrence of death by accident, in war, or from disease.

Floor Area of Building - refers to the sum of the area of each floor of the building measured to the outer surface of the outer walls including the area of lobbies, cellars, elevator shafts and all communal spaces in multi-dwellings. Areas of balconies are excluded.

Food Threshold - the minimum income required for a family/individual to meet the basic food needs, which satisfies the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities.

Fully Immunized Children (FIC) - an infant who received 1 dose of BCG, 3 doses each of OPV, DPT, Hepatitis B and 1 dose of anti-Measles vaccine before reaching one year old.

Government Efficiency - refers to the quality and reliability of government services and government support for effective and sustainable productive expansion. Conceptually, this factor looks at government as an institution that is generally not corrupt; able to protect and enforce contracts; apply moderate and reasonable taxation and is able to regulate proactively (La Porta et al, 1999). This represents the people and culture factor that Porter alluded to in understanding the process of competitiveness and making locations productive.

Hepatitis B - a vaccine-preventable liver infection caused by the hepatitis B virus (HBV). Hepatitis B is spread when blood, semen, or other body fluids from a person infected with the virus enters the body of someone who is not infected.

Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs) - refers to cities with a minimum population of (200,000 inhabitants, as certified by the National Statistics Office, and with the latest annual income of at least P50,000,000.00 based on 1991 constant prices, as certified by the city treasurer per Section 452 of Republic Act 7160).

Hospital Bed Capacity - refers to the maximum number of beds in an hospital at any given time for use of in-patients.

Household Population - refers to the population enumerated in private households during a census.

Income Gap - measures the average income needed by the poor to get out of poverty, expressed relatively to the poverty threshold.

Index Crimes - are crimes which are serious in nature and which occur with sufficient frequency and regularity such that they can serve as an index to the crime situation. Considered as index crimes are murder, homicide, physical injury (serious and less serious), carnapping, cattle rustling, robbery, theft, and rape.

Industrial Buildings - are all buildings used to house the production, assembly and warehousing activities of industrial establishments;
i.e. factories, plants, mills, repair shops, machine shops, printing press, storage plant, electric generating plants.

Infrastructure - refers to the physical building blocks that connect, expand, and sustain a locality and its surroundings to enable the provision of goods and services. It involves basic inputs of production such as energy, water; interconnection of production such as transportation, roads, and communications; sustenance of production such as waste, disaster preparedness, environmental sustainability and human capital formation infrastructure.

Institutional Buildings - are buildings which primarily engaged in providing educational instructions and hospital/health care; ports, airports and other government buildings; i.e. school, museums, libraries, sanitaria, churches, hospitals.

Institutional Population - the population enumerated during a census living in large institutions, such as national prisons and penal colonies, provincial and large city jails, tuberculosis sanitaria, mental hospitals, leprosaria, military, mining and logging camps, etc. The cut-off is more than 6-months duration.

Interest Expense - is the cost of borrowed funds. It is reported on the income statement as a nonoperating expense, and is derived from such lending arrangements as lines of credit, loans, and bonds. Interest expense is usually a tax-deductible expense, which makes debt a lower-cost form of funding than equity.

Interest Income - is the amount of interest that has been earned during a specific time period. It is earned from investments that pay interest, such as in a savings account or certificate of deposit. It is not the same as a dividend, which is paid to the holders of a company's common stock or preferred stock, and which represents a distribution of the issuing company's retained earnings.

Labor Force Participation Rate (LFPR) - percentage of the total number of persons in the labor force to the total population 15 years old and over.

Liabilities - something an entity owes, usually a sum of money. Liabilities are settled over time through the transfer of economic benefits including money, goods, or services.

Live Birth - refers to the complete expulsion or extraction from the mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which after such separation, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached.

Loans - is a form of debt incurred by an individual or other entity.

Marital Status - refers to the status of an individual in relation to marriage.

Marriage - refers to the social contract between two individuals that unites their lives legally, economically and emotionally.

Mid-year Population - refers to the estimated population for 1 July of the given year.

Mortality Rate - refers to the ratio of the number of deaths in the year to the average total population of the year.

Non-Current Assets - refers to long-term investments that are not easily converted to cash or are not expected to become cash within an accounting year.

Non-Current Liabilities - refers to long-term financial obligations listed on an entity's balance sheet.

Non-Fatalities Injuries - is bodily harm resulting from severe exposure to an external force or substance (mechanical, thermal, electrical, chemical, or radiant) or a submersion. This bodily harm can be unintentional or violence-related.

Non-Index Crimes - are violations of special laws such as illegal logging or local ordinances.

Non-Residential Building - something an entity owes, usually a sum of money. Liabilities are settled over time through the transfer of economic benefits including money, goods, or services.

Other Non-Building Constructions - include cemetery structures, street furniture, waiting sheds, communication towers, etc.

Other Residential Construction - consists of school or company staff houses, living quarters for drivers and maids, and guardhouses.

Percent Change - refers to a simple mathematical concept that represents the degree of change over time.

Place of Occurrence - refers to the place where the vital event took place.

Population Growth Rate - indicates how fast a population increases or decreases as a result of the interplay of births, deaths, and migration during a given period of time. Where the population is closed, meaning no migration, the population growth rate is the same as the rate of natural increase, i.e., the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths during a specified period of time. The three methods for computing the rate of growth based on the assumption with respect to the change are: arithmetic change, geometric change and exponential change.

Poverty Gap - the total income/ expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/ individuals with income/ expenditure below the poverty threshold, divided by the total number of families/ individuals.

Poverty Incidence - the proportion of families/individuals with per capita income less than the per capita poverty threshold to the total number of families/individuals.

Poverty Threshold - the minimum income required for a family/individual to meet the basic food and non-food requirements.

Pre-School Education - an educational establishment or learning space offering early childhood education to children before they begin compulsory education at primary school. It may be publicly or privately operated, and may be subsidized from public funds.

Public Health Worker - refers to those responsible for providing the essential services of public health regardless of the organization in which they work.

Religious Affiliation - refers to a particular system of beliefs, attitudes, emotions, and behaviors constituting man's relationship with the powers and principalities of the universe.

Repair - is a remedial work done on any damaged or deteriorated portion/s of a building/ structure to restore its original condition.

Residential Building - is a building for which its major parts or more than half of its gross floor area is built for dwelling purposes. This type of building can be of the single type, duplex, an apartment and/or accessoria and residential condominium.

Residential Condominium - is a structure, usually of several stories, consisting of multiple dwelling units.

Resiliency - the capacity of a locality to facilitate businesses and industries to create jobs, raise productivity, and increase the incomes of citizens over time despite of the shocks and stresses it encounters. This implies that the role of local governments is critical in ensuring a competitive environment to make businesses sustain their profits, create jobs, and increase the productivity of its people. In order for localities to be able to do this, it must be resilient in its infrastructure, governance, social and environmental systems.

Revenue - refers to the money generated from normal business operations.

Road Accidents - means an event that occurs during the movement, and with the participation, of a vehicle on a road, in which people are killed or injured, vehicles, equipment or goods are damaged, or any other material damage is caused.

Rural Banks - these banks are tasked with providing basic financial services to residents. These are meant to help promote and expand the local economy in an orderly and effective manner.

Secondary Education - also known as high school, and it consists of two levels: Lower Secondary Education (Junior High school): Grades 7 to 10. Upper Secondary Education (Senior High school): Grades 11 to 12.

Severity of Poverty - the total of the squared income/expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/ individuals with income/expenditure below the poverty threshold, divided by the total number of families/ individuals.

Sex Ratio - refers to the number of males per one hundred (100) females.

Single House - is a complete structure intended for a single family or household, i.e. bungalow, 2-storey house, nipa hut.

Solved Crimes - A crime shall be considered solved when: (1) the following elements concur: the offender has been taken into custody and the offender has been charged before the prosecutor's office or court of appropriate jurisdiction; (2) some elements beyond police control prevent the arrest of the offender, such as when the victim refuses to prosecute after the offender is identified or the offender dies or absconds; (3) the arrest of one offender can solve several crimes or several offenders may be arrested in the process of solving one crime.

Statement of Financial Position - a formal statement which shows the financial condition of the entity as at a certain date. It includes information on the three elements of financial position - assets, liabilities and equity.

Subsistence Incidence - the proportion of families/individuals with per capita income less than the per capita food threshold to the total number of families/individuals.

Syphilis - a bacterial infection usually spread by sexual contact. The disease starts as a painless sore — typically on the genitals, rectum or mouth. Syphilis spreads from person to person via skin or mucous membrane contact with these sores.

Tax Revenue - defined as the funds collected from taxes on income and profits.

Tertiary Education - refers to all formal post-secondary education, including public and private universities, colleges, technical training institutes, and vocational schools.

Thrift Banks - this category is made up of savings and mortgage banks, private development banks, and stock savings and loan associations. These banks focus on accumulating and investing depositors' savings, while also providing short-term working capital, and medium- and long-term financing.

Total population - total number of individuals in a territory at a specified time. It covers both nationals and aliens, native- and foreign-born persons, internees, refugees and any other group physically present within the borders of a country at a specified time. In assembling national demographic statistics for publication, the basic aim has been to obtain data for the physically present (or de facto) population rather than for the legally established resident (or de jure) inhabitants.

Total value of construction - refers to the sum of the cost of building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, and others. The value is derived from the approved building permit and represents the estimated value of the building or structure when completed.

Underemployment Rate - percentage of the total number of underemployed persons to the total number of employed persons.

Unemployment Rate - percentage of the total number of unemployed persons to the total number of persons in the labor force.

Universal banks - are also allowed to perform underwriting and other functions of investment houses. They can also invest in non-allied undertakings, as well as own up to 100% of the equity in a thrift bank, a rural bank, a financial allied enterprise, or a non-financial allied enterprise.

Urban Barangays - refers to the barangays that have a population size of 5,000 or more, or have at least one establishment with a minimum of 100 employees, or have 5 or more establishments with a minimum of 10 employees, and 5 or more facilities.

Usual Residence - refers to the place where the person habitually or permanently resides.



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
