The NCR PSO II hosted a Seminar on Anti-Online Sexual Abuse on 20 March to raise awareness and encourage preventive action. The seminar featured speakers from the District Women and Children Concern Section of PNP-Quezon City Police District (QCPD): PCMS Jona R. Madrazo, PCMS Joyce F. Peñaflor, and PCpl Rez Nunag.

PCMS Madrazo emphasized the dangers of online sexual abuse, its rising incidence, and the critical role of community vigilance. She urged participants to be observant of their neighborhoods and to support victims through counseling and reporting mechanisms. The seminar highlighted the importance of collective action in addressing and preventing online sexual abuse.

Self-Defense Training builds preparedness

On the same day as the Seminar on Anti-Online Sexual Abuse, the NCR PSO II organized a Basic Self-Defense Training activity. PSMS Mark Roger G. Versoza, from the Special Weapons and Tactics-District Mobile Force Battalion (SWAT-DMFB) of the PNP-QCPD led the practical session

PSMS Versoza provided valuable insights on personal safety, emphasizing risk assessment, situational awareness, and practical self-defense techniques.



The training aimed to equip the employees with essential skills to confidently handle real-life situations. By integrating de-escalation strategies with simple yet effective self-defense techniques, the session enhanced participants' physical preparedness and their ability to assess and manage potential threats.


A total of 80 employees participated in the event.

Ms. Jenny G. Amora, Senior Statistical Specialist from PSA NCR PSO II, led the session with an in-depth discussions in the areas of population, labor and employment, and vital statistics. She presented insights into gender gaps in economic participation and access to resources.

The forum drew active participation from both students and faculty, who engaged in open discussions and shared reflections on the data presented.

Ms. Amora closed the event by highlighting the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), and SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities). She stressed the importance of statistical literacy in achieving global objectives and in promoting a more equitable society.
